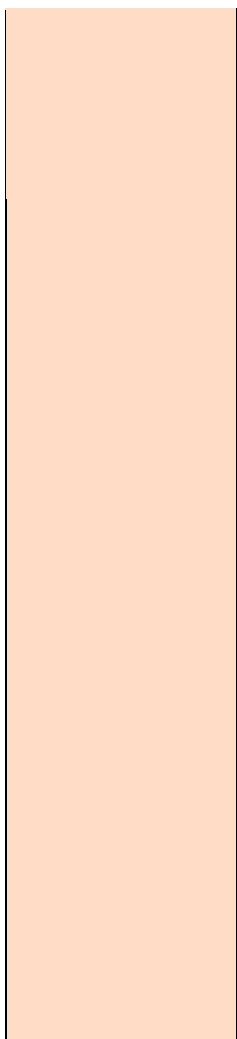

	<p>This plan allows for staggered recruitment and activities in order to allow the project to be developed in a sustainable model. Recruitment and retention is an issue of concern in the NT, although the recruitment of midwives from interstate in particular , has been less difficult in recent years. Training of locally-based Aboriginal Health Workers, Community-based child health workers and Strong Women Strong Babies Strong Culture Workers is planned over the next years. This will strengthen the capacity to implement programs in local communities.</p>
