# **WOMEN'S SAFETY PACKAGE – TECHNOLOGY TRIALS (Queensland)**

**PROJECT AGREEMENT FOR THE *WOMEN'S SAFETY PACKAGE -  
TECHNOLOGY TRIALS***

1. This schedule has been developed in accordance with clause 11(a) of the Project Agreement for the *Women's Safety Package – Technology Trials*. It will commence as soon as it is agreed between the Commonwealth and Queensland and expire on 30 June 2020 or on completion of the technology trials, including final performance reporting and processing of final payments against milestones.
2. Queensland will trial technology to provide a secure environment for specialist domestic and family violence (DFV) service providers and Government Agencies supporting high risk clients between 2016-17 and 2017-18.
3. The technology trial supporting DFV high risk teams comprises:
  - (a) project management requirements including:
    - i. selecting and procuring a provider to deliver a technology solution to:
      1. support an integrated service response;
      2. allow for streamlined referral pathways and timely support services; and
      3. allow for effective and secure sharing of information between Government and non-government agencies;
    - ii. development and implementation of organisational change activities including training across the State; and
  - (b) technical requirements, including hardware or software specifications to:
    - i. meet the needs outlined in section 3 (a) (i);
    - ii. consider ICT platforms for case management and referrals, that are sustainable and cost effective; and
    - iii. determine the suitability for state-wide rollout.
  - (c) a project evaluation of the trial technology, including the detailed lessons learned and national applicability.
4. Queensland will also conduct a scoping study in 2017-18 to explore options to monitor high risk perpetrators of domestic and family violence, taking into account the full range of potential technological solutions, including the use of GPS monitoring. The study will include analysing

the full range of potential technological options, comparative costs, suitability to existing systems and compatibility with the GPS monitoring initiatives in other States and Territories.

- In accordance with clause 13 of the Agreement, milestones for activities within the projects, their relationship to outputs, expected completion dates, relevant reporting dates and expected payments are set out in Tables 1 and 2.
