PROJECT AGREEMENT ON IMPROVING TRACHOMA CONTROL SERVICES FOR INDIGENOUS AUSTRALIANS

- 1. This Schedule has been developed in accordance with clause 16(a) of the Project Agreement on Improving Trachoma Control Services for Indigenous Australians. It will commence as soon as it is agreed between the Commonwealth and Northern Territory, and expire on 30 June 2021 or on completion of the feasibility studies, including final performance reporting and processing of final payments against milestones.
- 2. In accordance with clause 8 and 17 of the Agreement, milestones, their relationship to outputs, expected completion dates, relevant reporting dates and expected payments are set out in Table 1.
