5. Project will enhance, develop and implement local approaches to providing high quality palliative care for people in Residential Aged Care Facilities (RACFs). Funding will support local initiatives in NSW Health's 15 Local Health Districts (LHDs) and St Vincent's Healthcare Network (SVHN), and state-wide level support to improve palliative care in RACFs. Individual local approaches will be determined according to local priorities, population needs, available service capacity and other local factors.

- 6. The objectives of specific initiatives will be determined at local level. They will include:
 - a. increased specialist palliative care activity in RACFs for people with complex needs;
 - b. improved equity of access to specialist palliative care for people in RACFs in line with needs;
 - c. improved care coordination, including multidisciplinary care planning and escalation/referral pathways; and
 - d. supporting capacity building of RACF workforce to provide palliative care, including making Advance Care Plans and end of life care planning, recognition and response to patient deterioration at the end of life.
- 7. Project 1 expectations:
 - a. Local initiatives will be in place by June 2023 in up to 10 LHDs in NSW. NSW Health workforce enhancements for palliative care in RACFs will include up to 12 additional full-time equivalent palliative care nurses across NSW.
 - b. Evidence of improved palliative care for people in RACFs will be demonstrated against local targets in up to 6 LHDs by June 2023 and up to 8 LHDs by June 2024.
- 8. In accordance with clause 15 of the Agreement, milestones for projects, their relationship to outputs, expected completion dates, relevant reporting dates and expected payments are set out in Table 1.
