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Linkages and Coordination	ACT Health aims to initiate and maintain a collaborative project model.  The specific linkages will be determined by the 'Antenatal care, pre-pregnancy and teenage sexual and reproductive health Steering Committee'. The core agencies involved however will be: ACT Health; Canberra Sexual Health Centre; Sexual Health and Family Planning ACT; Winnunga Nimmityjah Aboriginal Health Service; Gugan Gulwan Youth Service; and Anglicare's Junction Youth Health Service.  This project will also work collaboratively with ACT Health's 'Stamp Out Chlamydia II' project. This project has been funded by the ACT Government, and aims to provide 'a range of social marketing and peer education strategies targeting young people at risk of developing Chlamydia and related sexually transmitted infections. Targeted outreach screening will be a key component of this initiative'. A SFA has been created between Sexual Health and Family Planning ACT and ACT Health.
