Dear Minister *Warren,*

I am writing to advise you of Black Spot Program funding for Queensland following the announcements by the Australian Government on 12 December 2008 and 3 February 2009 of additional Black Spot funding under the Nation Building packages.

Queensland will receive \$31.123 million in 08-09 (comprising \$12.856 million under the standard program, \$12.178 million under Nation Building 1 and \$6.089 million under Nation Building 2). Queensland's Black Spot Program allocation in 2009-10 is \$24.256 million (comprising \$12.078 million under the standard program and \$12.178 million under Nation Building 2). Queensland will then receive \$12.078 million per annum from 2010-11 to 2013-14.

A portion of the extra funding announced on 3 February 2009 will be allocated to black spots on the National Network. My Department has previously advised the Department of Main Roads that the amount of funding currently identified for black spots on the National Network under the Nation Building 2 funding is \$15 million in 2008-09 and \$15 million in 2009-10 nationally. The maximum amount of funding currently available to Queensland for Network black spot projects from the allocations set out above is \$3.417 million in 2008-09 and \$3.417 million in 2009-10. This can be used for state and local road projects if Queensland chooses not to put forward Network projects.

At the Special Council of Australian Governments meeting on 5 February 2009 it was agreed that States are to submit nominations for Black Spot funding to the Commonwealth as soon as possible and no later than 31 March 2009. I note that at the Strategic Committee on Transport meeting on 11 February 2009, Queensland agreed to submit recommended Black Spot projects by 27 February 2009. I would be grateful if you would work toward meeting this agreed deadline. It is important that proposals are submitted as soon as possible as this will assist in meeting the deadline and enable approvals and payments to commence.


The additional Black Spot funding for Queensland in 2008-09 will be paid prior to 30 June 2009 for approved projects expected to be complete by 31 December 2009. Queensland is required to hold the funds and any interest earned in such a way that it is able to be identified separately. Savings on particular projects and/or any interest earned may be expended on other approved projects or new projects subject to the agreement of the Australian Government.

Queensland will be required to provide a report on the progress of projects approved for the 2008-09 additional funding by 31 July 2009 and by 31 January 2010. The additional Black Spot funding for Queensland in 2009-10 will be paid during 2009-10 on the basis of status reports. My Department will liaise directly with your department in relation to these reporting requirements. In addition, if required, statements of expenditure and details of any balance of funds will be provided on request to the Australian Government.

Project variation requests in relation to projects approved under the additional Black Spot funding should be made in accordance with the Black Spot Program Notes on Administration (the Notes). The recognition and signage requirements set out in the Notes also apply to the Nation Building Package projects.

I seek your agreement to the conditions outlined in this letter relating to the Nation Building Package projects and I look forward to working with you on these important safety works.
