Implementation Plan for COAG Strategy on Water and Wastewater Services in Remote (including Indigenous) Communities – Queensland

NATIONAL PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT ON WATER FOR THE FUTURE

PRELIMINARIES

- This Implementation Plan is created subject to the provisions of the *National Partnership Agreement* on *Water for the Future* and should be read in conjunction with that Agreement. The objective in the Agreement is to secure water supplies and to assist with climate change adaptation.
- A strategy on water and wastewater services in remote (including Indigenous) communities has been developed by relevant jurisdictions under the 2008-2011 COAG Work Program on Water. The objectives of this Strategy are to provide sustainable, secure and safe water supplies and wastewater services; provide a level of service that meets regulatory standards that would apply to any other community of similar size and location; and encourage responsible water use and where appropriate, water conservation.
- The Commonwealth will provide a financial contribution of \$8.496 million for three projects to assist Queensland implement the strategy.
- 4 Queensland is implementing water and wastewater activities in remote indigenous communities under the Environmental Health Infrastructure Program, including complementary works to those being carried out under this Implementation Plan.

TERMS OF THIS IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- This Implementation Plan will commence as soon as it is agreed between the Commonwealth of Australia, represented by the Parliamentary Secretary for Sustainability and Urban Water, and the State of Queensland, represented by the Minister responsible for local government ('the parties').
- This Implementation Plan will cease on completion of the project (scheduled for completion by June 2014), including acceptance by the Commonwealth of final performance reporting and processing of final payments against project milestones specified in this Implementation Plan.
- 7 This Implementation Plan may be varied by written agreement between the Ministers or their delegates.
- 8 Each Party may terminate this Implementation Plan by providing 30 days notice in writing. Where this Implementation Plan is terminated, the Commonwealth's liability to make payments to Queensland is limited to payments associated with project milestones achieved by Queensland.
- 9 The Parties to this Implementation Plan do not intend any of the provisions to be legally enforceable. However, that does not lessen the Parties' commitment to this Implementation Plan.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- The objective of this Implementation Plan is to provide sustainable, secure and safe water supplies and wastewater services to the communities of Woorabinda and Wujal Wujal, and build capacity in a number of identified priority communities in Queensland.
- The project consists of three sub-projects listed in Schedule A. These sub-projects will provide water and wastewater infrastructure and build the capacity of the relevant water supply authorities to improve the management and overall security of water and wastewater services in the communities.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Role of the Commonwealth

The Commonwealth Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities is responsible for reviewing Queensland's performance against the Project Milestones specified in this Implementation Plan and providing any consequential financial contribution to Queensland for that performance.

Role of the State

- 13 Queensland will have responsibility for:
 - a) fully funding the Project after accounting for financial contributions from the Commonwealth and any third party;
 - b) completing the Project in a timely and professional manner in accordance with this Implementation Plan;
 - c) implementing actions endorsed in the strategy on water and wastewater services in remote (including Indigenous) communities to support and complement the Project; and
 - d) meeting all conditions including providing reports, in accordance with this Implementation Plan.
- 14 Queensland agrees to allow, at all reasonable times, appropriate Commonwealth representatives access to all sites where Project works are being or have been undertaken.
- Oueensland agrees to establish a Project Management Committee (the Committee) to monitor and oversee the implementation of the Project. The Commonwealth, at its option, may be an observer.
- Queensland agrees to ensure that prior agreement is reached with the Commonwealth on the nature and content of any events, announcements, promotional material or publicity relating to the activity under this Implementation Plan, and the roles of both the Commonwealth and Queensland will be acknowledged and recognised appropriately.
- Oueensland agrees to have in place a detailed project management plan for each sub-project, including but not limited to, a procurement strategy, communication, risk and stakeholder plans. It should conduct a fair and defensible competitive procurement process to select any subcontractors involved in the Project. The selection and appointment of any subcontractor must adhere to all Commonwealth and Queensland legislation and codes relevant to the project work.

FUNDING, MILESTONES AND PAYMENTS

The maximum funding to be provided by the Commonwealth for the Project is \$8,496,000 payable in accordance with forecast reports and milestones as set out in Table 1.

- Any Commonwealth financial contribution payable will be processed by the Commonwealth Treasury and paid to the Queensland Treasury in accordance with the payment arrangements set out in Schedule D of the *Intergovernmental Agreement on Federal Financial Relations*.

BUDGET

The Overall Project Budget for each component of the project is set out in Tables 2, 3 and 4. GST is not payable on amounts paid by the Commonwealth under this implementation plan.

Having regard to the estimated costs of projects specified in the overall Project budget, Queensland will not be required to pay a refund to the Commonwealth if the actual cost of the Project is less than the agreed estimated cost of the Project. Similarly, Queensland bears all risk should the costs of a project exceed the estimated costs. The Parties acknowledge that this arrangement provides the maximum incentive for Queensland to deliver projects cost-effectively and efficiently.

REPORTING ARRANGEMENTS

- 23 A Monitoring, Evaluation and Reporting Plan will be developed as part of this Implementation Plan.
- 24 Each Forecast / Progress Report is to contain the following information:
 - a) a description of actual performance of the Project to date against the project milestone/s, and budget listed in Schedule A, including a statement as to whether the Project is proceeding in accordance with the milestone activity schedule as set out in this Implementation Plan and if it is not, an explanation as to why and the action Queensland proposes to take to address the matter/s;
 - b) details of all contracts in place and funds required to complete the work to be undertaken;
 - c) promotional activities undertaken in relation to, and media coverage of, the sub-projects listed in Schedule A during the last reporting period; and
 - d) a description of the work that will be undertaken to complete the remaining project milestone(s) listed in Schedule A, and any expected promotional opportunities, during the next reporting period for the Project
 - e) a report on the implementation by Queensland of the actions endorsed in the strategy for water and wastewater services for remote (including Indigenous) communities.
- The final Project Report is due within 60 Business Days of the completion of the Project (or termination of this Implementation Plan or the Project) and will be a stand-alone document that can be used for public information dissemination purposes regarding the Project. The final Project Report must:
 - a) describe the conduct, benefits and outcomes of the Project as a whole;
 - b) evaluate the Project, including assessing the extent to which the objective has been achieved and explaining why any aspect were not achieved; and
 - c) include a discussion of any other matters, relating to the Project, which the Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities notifies Queensland should be included in this final Project Report at least 60 days before it is due.
- 26 Queensland agrees to meet any reasonable request by the Commonwealth to provide other information regarding the Project implementation or funding conditions.
