INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ON FEDERAL FINANCIAL RELATIONS

Preliminaries

A1. Schedule B (this Schedule) varies the National Partnership Agreement on Preventive Health (the Agreement). Variations are specified in this Schedule. In all other respects, the National Partnership Agreement remains unchanged.

Clause 18 - replaces

Payments to States and Territories for the Healthy children and Healthy workers programs will be structured as 75 per cent facilitation and 25 per cent reward. Payments to the States and Territories for the social marketing and enabling infrastructure programs will be provided as facilitation payments, and will not be subject to a reward structure. (g) Clause 19

Performance against benchmarks for healthy children and healthy workers will be assessed as at June 2013 and December 2014. Of the funds available for reward payments (50 per cent of Healthy children and Healthy workers), 20 per cent will be paid against June 2013 achievement of benchmarks and 30 per cent against December 2014 achievement of benchmarks.

Clause 19 - replaces

Performance against benchmarks will be assessed as at June 2016 and December 2017. Of the funds available for reward payments, 50 percent will be paid against June 2016 achievement of benchmarks and 50 per cent against December 2017 achievement of benchmarks.

(h) Clause 21

The Parties will agree an Implementation Plan to achieve the objectives of this Agreement. The Plan will be reviewed by the Parties on an annual basis.

- (a) The Commonwealth will maintain the Plans and provide updated Plans to the States and Territories following reviews.
- (b) The Plans will include the timelines for achieving the performance benchmarks, including phased achievement of performance benchmarks where appropriate.
- (c) Amendments to the Plan can be requested by a State or Territory at any time, to accommodate emerging issues. These amendments will be agreed with the Commonwealth and the other Parties.

Clause 21 - replaces

The Parties will agree a National Implementation Plan to achieve the objectives of this Agreement. The Plan will be reviewed by the Parties on an annual basis.

- a) The Commonwealth will maintain the Plan and provide an updated Plan to the States and Territories following reviews.
- b) The Plan will include the timelines for achieving the performance benchmarks, including phased achievement of performance benchmarks where appropriate.
- c) Amendments to the Plan can be requested by a State or Territory at any time, to accommodate emerging issues. These amendments will be agreed with the Commonwealth and the other Parties.
