

# Variation to the National Partnership Agreement on Preventive Health

## INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ON FEDERAL FINANCIAL RELATIONS

### Preliminaries

- A1. Schedule B (this Schedule) varies the National Partnership Agreement on Preventive Health (the Agreement). Variations are specified in this Schedule. In all other respects, the National Partnership Agreement remains unchanged.


