This operational plan details surveillance activity for a specified period within the State and aligns to the national implementation plan developed by the Commonwealth and agreed with Parties.</p> <p>The States will be responsible for providing a financial and/or in-kind contribution to support the NPHSP implementation as provided in Table 1 above. The State will commit these resources for delivery of the NPHSP annually through the operational plan. 
