Implementation Plan for Urban Waterways Renewal Project, Western Australia

NATIONAL PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT ON WATER FOR THE FUTURE

PRELIMINARIES

- 1 This Implementation Plan is created subject to the provisions of the *National Partnership Agreement on Water for the Future* and should be read in conjunction with that Agreement.
- 2 The Commonwealth has agreed to provide financial assistance of \$4 million to the Perth metropolitan 'Urban Waterways Renewal' project for integrated actions identified in the Swan Canning Water Quality Improvement Plan to reduce nitrogen and phosphorus in the Swan Canning river system. The Project is scheduled to be completed by June 2012.
- 3 The parties acknowledge that Western Australia is committed to Urban Waterways Renewal and has agreed to provide funding up \$4,562,830 and that the infrastructure projects funded under this implementation plan will be jointly funded.

PROJECT

- 4 The Urban Waterways Renewal project consists of a suite of 11 sub-projects (listed in Schedule A) focusing on implementing priority actions identified in the Swan Canning Water Quality Improvement Plan and the local Water Quality Improvement Plans for Bannister Creek, Southern River and Bickley Brook catchments. Through the conversion of existing urban drainage lines into living streams and by improving water retention and infiltration capabilities of compensation basins, stormwater quality will be improved and reuse potential created in these priority Canning catchments.
- 5 This project also has the potential to be a significant demonstration tool for application of water sensitive urban design principles across other major urban areas and improve the capacity of local governments to implement stormwater best management practice. The effectiveness of treatments applied in this project will be monitored and data used to inform future drainage intervention works and calibrate catchment models.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Role of the Commonwealth

6 The Commonwealth is responsible for reviewing the State's performance against the Project milestones in accordance with this Implementation Plan.

Role of the State

- 7 The State will have responsibility for:
 - a) completing the Project in a timely and professional manner in accordance with this Implementation Plan.
 - b) meeting all conditions including providing the Reports, in accordance with this Implementation Plan.
- 8 The State agrees to establish a Project Management Committee (the Committee) to monitor and oversee the implementation of the Project. A Commonwealth representative will be an observer and may attend and participate in all meetings (via telephone or in person).
- 9 The State agrees to have in place a Project Agreement with each project partner, including but not limited to, a procurement strategy, communication, risk and stakeholder plans.
- 10 The State will enter into agreements with each financial project partner to ensure the security of shared funding commitments, as outlined in Table 3 of this agreement plus ongoing maintenance of the assets concerned.

FUNDING, MILESTONES AND PAYMENTS

- 11 The maximum funding to be provided by the Commonwealth for the Project is \$4,000,000 payable in accordance with milestones set out in Table 1 below.
- 12 Subject to the terms of this Implementation Plan including any right the Commonwealth has to reduce or withhold Funds, the Commonwealth will pay the Funds to the State as specified in Table **2** below.

- 16 The final Project Report is due within 60 Business Days of the completion of the Project (or termination of this Implementation Plan or the Project) and will be a stand-alone document that can be used for public information dissemination purposes regarding the Project. The final Project Report must:
 - a) describe the conduct, benefits and outcomes of the Project as a whole;
 - b) evaluate the Project, including assessing the extent to which the objective has been achieved and explaining why any aspect were not achieved; and
 - c) include a discussion of any other matters, relating to the Project, which DEWHA notifies the State should be included in this final Project Report at least 30 days before it is due.
- 14 A report providing the scientific evaluation of the water quality objectives of the project be submitted by 31 December 2012.

REQUESTS FOR REPORTS AND INFORMATION

15 The State agrees to meet any reasonable request by the Commonwealth to provide other reports, or access to information, sites or assets to enable assessment or review of the implementation of the project.
