## Context for the Wilcannia Weir Refurbishment Project

- 1. The New South Wales and Australian governments announced joint funding for the Wilcannia Weir Refurbishment Project (the Project) on 12 November 2018.
- 2. The Commonwealth contribution forthis Project is a maximum of 50% of the project costs up to \$15 million (GST exclusive). This funding has been made available to improve the outcomes for indigenous Basin communities and address the social and economic impacts of the Murray-Darling Basin Plan.
- 3. In 2019, New South Wales received \$75,000 (GST exclusive) in Commonwealth funding for the development of an addendum to an existing business case which had been prepared by New South Wales in 2016. As such, a maximum of \$14.925 million of the Australian Government commftment remains available for these works.
- 4. In May 2020, New South Wales advised that the Project would be subject to an environmental impact assessment under the Commonwealth *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*, and that these environmental approval processes (and any approval conditions) were requisite to the finalisation of detailed project costings (P90) for the Project.
- 5. This schedule enables further project funding (to be known as Stage 2) to be provided to New South Wales primarily to progress the detailed planning (inclusive of final project costings) for all elements of the Project, obtain relevant environmental approvals, and undertake scoping activities for two culturally-sensitive sub-projects of significance to the local Wilcannia community.
- 6. Once New South Wales has submitted the final draft Capital Project Plan under this Schedule, the Commonwealth will be able to recommence its due diligence assessment of the project to support a decision by the Commonwealth Minister on the remainder of the Commonwealth's financial commitment to the project.
- 7. Following that, and subject to such decisions, Parties expect this Schedule will be varied to cover the delivery of the on-ground and other project works (to be known as Stage 3), and related Commonwealth funding against the commitment.

## Requirements of the Capital Project Plan

- 1. In finalising the final draft Capital Project Plan, New South Wales will ensure that the plan includes sufficient information to enable the Commonwealth to make a sound and defensible decision on any future funding for the Project.
- 2. This plan will be a culmination of the planning works undertaken by New South Wales (and any of their agents or subcontractors) for the project and will be a single source of information for the Project that includes:
  - a. Final plans supported by various technical and engineering investigations, relevant surveying work, environmental and heritage studies
  - b. Final draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) including details of any proposed biodiversity offsets
  - c. Final and defensible project costings (P90) for all elements of the project, noting that the Commonwealth will not provide funding for services that are provided by State government agencies or their corporate entities at commercial rates
  - d. Delivery plan and timeline for all on-ground works and other project activities
  - e. Compliance with relevant Commonwealth and State building code legislation
  - f. Details of the ownership and long-term operation of the refurbished weir
  - g. Communications and stakeholder engagement plan for the delivery phase of the Project.
