

Parties	Commonwealth South Australia
Duration	This Schedule is expected to expire on 30 June 2022.
Purpose	<p>This Schedule will support the delivery of business support packages (the packages) to eligible South Australian businesses financially impacted by lockdowns due to COVID-19. Details of each package can be found in the relevant appendix to this Schedule.</p> <p>Implementation and compliance will be managed by South Australia.</p>
Reporting arrangements	<p>At the conclusion of each support package, South Australia must provide a report to the Commonwealth that includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> total number of unique applications received, total number of unique applications paid, total value of applications paid total value of payments already made to businesses that were subsequently found, to have been ineligible for support under this scheme; and a statement of assurance confirming that the money has been disbursed to applicants in accordance with the criteria set out in the appendices to the Schedule. <p>The data should be broken down by each element of each support package as set out in the appendices to the Schedule.</p> <p>The final reports should be provided to the Commonwealth as soon as practicable after the conclusion of each package.</p> <p>The Commonwealth may request additional data on the support packages in writing.</p>
Estimated financial contributions	The Commonwealth's financial contributions under each package will be set out in the appendices to this Schedule.

	Payments to South Australia will be made following the conclusion of each package based on the final reports provided by South Australia.
Additional terms	<p>South Australia agrees to implement each package in accordance with the parameters outlined in the Appendix.</p> <p>Where businesses that received a support payment are later found to have been ineligible, South Australia will repay the Commonwealth's financial contributions towards those businesses where the funding has been recovered.</p> <p>Repayments to the Commonwealth may be managed by either the Commonwealth reducing a future payment to South Australia under this Schedule by the relevant amount, or by the Commonwealth invoicing South Australia for the relevant amount.</p> <p>Sole traders who receive business support through the programs listed in the appendices will not be eligible to receive the COVID-19 Disaster Payment for the same relevant period.</p>

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Appendix A: South Australia business support announced

9 August 2021

1. This appendix to the *Business support payments – South Australia* Schedule (the Schedule) supports the delivery of the South Australia Business Support Package announced on 9 August 2021 (this package). This package (known as the South Australia COVID-19 Additional Business Support Grant) will give South Australian small and medium sized businesses further financial support as they continue to recover from the recent lockdown. The package has an estimated value of \$18 million.
2. The Commonwealth will reimburse South Australia 50 per cent of all payments made to eligible businesses under this package.
3. Payment to South Australia will be made following the provision of a report in relation to this package that satisfies the requirements outlined in the Schedule.
4. In agreeing to this appendix, South Australia agrees to implement this package, for the listed programs, in accordance with the parameters and eligibility criteria detailed below.

Grants

5. There are two types of grants available:
 - 5.1. \$3,000 for employing businesses
 - 5.2. \$1,000 for non-employing businesses
6. A further \$1,000 will be available for eligible businesses (employing and non-employing) with a commercial premise in the Adelaide CBD.

Eligibility criteria

7. Eligible businesses for both grants must, as at the start of the restriction period (12:01 am, Wednesday 28 July 2021):
 - 7.1. Have a valid and active Australian business number (ABN) and were carrying on the operation of a business in South Australia;
 - 7.2. Be registered for the GST;
 - 7.3. have an Australia-wide grouped payroll of less than \$10 million in the 2019-20 financial year;
 - 7.4. operate in an eligible industry sector identified in the list of eligible ANZSIC classes (see Attachment A), and
 - 7.5. have experienced at least a 30 per cent reduction in turnover over the two weeks from 28 July 2021 (the commencement date of the trading restriction) compared to average fortnightly turnover in the June quarter 2021 (prior to restrictions) due to the restricted trading conditions.
 - 7.5.1. Businesses must be able to provide evidence of this reduction in turnover if requested and retain these records for 2 years from the date the grant was approved.
 - 7.5.2. Applications may be subject to audit.
 - 7.5.3. Where multiple non-employing businesses meeting the eligibility criteria are controlled by one individual, company, partnership, or trustee, funding will be restricted to one grant for all non-employing businesses controlled by the individual, company, partnership or trustee.

This Appendix was agreed by the Commonwealth and South Australia when the overarching Schedule was signed.

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Appendix B: South Australia business support announced 13 September 2021

1. This appendix to the *Business support payments – South Australia* Schedule (the Schedule) supports the delivery of the South Australia Business Support Package announced on 13 September 2021 (this package). This new package includes the COVID-19 Tourism and Hospitality Support Grant and COVID-19 Business Hardship Grant. It will give South Australian small and medium tourism and hospitality related businesses impacted by on-going trading restrictions and border closures, further financial support. The package has an estimated value of \$15 million.
2. The Commonwealth will reimburse South Australia 50 per cent of all payments made to eligible businesses under this package.
3. Payment to South Australia will be made following the provision of a report in relation to this package that satisfies the requirements outlined in the Schedule.
4. In agreeing to this appendix, South Australia agrees to implement this package, for the listed programs, in accordance with the parameters and eligibility criteria detailed below.

COVID-19 Tourism and Hospitality Support Grant

Grants

5. There are four types of top up grants available:
 - 5.1. \$1,000 for non-employing businesses
 - 5.2. \$3,000 for employing businesses with turnover less than \$2 million
 - 5.3. \$10,000 for employing businesses with turnover of greater than \$2 million
 - 5.4. \$20,000 for employing businesses with turnover of greater than \$5 million
6. These payments are on top of grants already received under the COVID-19 Additional Business Support Grant.

Eligibility criteria

7. The COVID-19 Tourism and Hospitality Support Grant is available for businesses in eligible tourism and hospitality sectors (and other sectors such as performing arts, creative artists, taxis and car rental – see Attachment B) that have already received the COVID-19 Additional Support Grant.

COVID-19 Business Hardship Grant

Grants

8. There are two types of grants available:
 - 8.1. \$2,000 for non-employing businesses
 - 8.2. \$6,000 for employing businesses with annual Australia wide grouped payroll of less than \$10 million in 2019-20.

Eligibility criteria

9. The COVID-19 Business Hardship Grant is available for businesses that:
 - 9.1. have experienced a 50 per cent reduction in turnover over the eligible period (20 July 2021 to 31 August 2021 compared to 20 July 2019 to 31 August 2019 or relevant benchmark period); and
 - 9.2. have not received previous South Australian COVID-19 support packages launched on or after 20 July 2021; and
 - 9.3. Are located/operating in South Australia and have a valid Australian Business Number and are registered for GST.
