## Off-farm Efficiency Program: State-led South Australia Marion Water Efficiency Project

## FEDERATION FUNDING AGREEMENT - ENVIRONMENT

This Schedule is expected to expire on 30 June 2024.					
The Commonwealth is providing funding to support South Australia's delivery of the Marion Water Efficiency Project.					
Through this project, South Australia will substitute the River Murray water used for open space irrigation in metropolitan Adelaide with treated stormwater from an existing scheme at Oaklands Park by:					
<ul> <li>extending the existing supply network of pipe to transport recycled stormwater to the irrigation sites;</li> </ul>					
<ul> <li>installing a new tank, aquifer injection system and recovery bore for additional above and below ground storage;</li> </ul>					
<ul> <li>installing new pumps to meet pressure requirements; and</li> <li>implementing water treatment facilities to ensure water is of sufficient quality to meet future demands.</li> </ul>					
The infrastructure improvements will result in greater water-use efficiency. This includes water savings of 143.49 ML of River Murray entitlement with 100 percent of the savings to be transferred to the Commonwealth: the current Long-Term Average Annual Yield (LTAAY) being 126.56 ML/y. By delivering the project, South Australia will also increase diversification of the water supply mix for greening and cooling through increased stormwater use, and reduce impacts on the near-shore marine environment through reduced stormwater discharge.					
This schedule is approved on the basis that the project and activities identified satisfy s86AD of the Water for the Environment Special Account (in Pt 2AA of the <i>Water Act 2007</i> ).					
South Australia has confirmed that the project is exempted from the Murray-Darling Basin Ministerial Council's socio-economic assessment agreed in December 2018, however a high-level socio-economic assessmen has been completed and South Australia was satisfied that the Project has

	The final report, including final financial reporting, must be provided within six months of the expiry of this schedule or within six months of practical completion of the project (whichever comes first).

	South Australia will be responsible for ensuring that, for the purposes of certifying practical completion, the project will:						
	(a) Be complete and free from defects or ommissions, except for defects or omissions that are minor in nature, that South Australia cannot reasonably fix, or by fixing, will significantly inconvenience users of the works;						
	(b) Not cause any legal or physical impediment to the use of occupation of the property and the works for the designated use; and						
	(c) Be fit for the designated use.						
	South Australia will, where there is a shortfall between the actual water saved as a result of the project activities and the total agreed water savings in this schedule, make up this shortfall and ensure the 143.49 ML/y of high security water entitlements are transferred to the Commonwealth before 30 June 2024.
