	Victoria's funding allocation reflects that one individual is housed under a CDO in Victoria (at the time of Schedule preparation) and that at least two additional terrorist offenders in Victoria will be under consideration for a CDO application by the Department of Home Affairs in 2021-22. For the purposes of this Schedule it is assumed that no more than two			
	individuals will be subject to a CDO in 2021-22.

1. Victoria will provide a quarterly milestone report (on 31 December 2021, 31 March 2022 and 10 May 2022) identifying achievements against performance milestones for the Outputs listed in table 2.

In addition, milestone reports in relation to CDO and IDO accommodation and management costs for the 2020-21 financial year will be provided by Victoria to the Commonwealth as soon as practicable (within four weeks) following execution of this

The first milestone report (31 December) will capture work undertaken by Victoria between 1 July and 31 December 2021,

Schedule for services already rendered.

- 3. Payments for Output 2C and 2D (CDO accommodation and CDO readiness costs) are contingent services. Victoria cannot claim payments for both services in the same quarter, nor can the responsible Minister seek to re-allocate these payments to other Outputs.
- 4. Outputs 3 and 4 (complex management and ESO establishment and governance costs) are also contingent services. However, where required milestones are not met for Outputs 3 and 4 in a reporting period, the responsible Commonwealth and Victorian Ministers can redirect the allocated funding to another Output identified in Table 2 of this Schedule or additional Outputs, as agreed between the responsible Commonwealth and Victorian Ministers.

Output 2C - Housing a terrorist offender subject to an IDO or CDO (1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022)

5. It is noted that the total quantum of payments listed in the 'payments' column of table 2 exceeds the funding envelope set out in the 'Estimated Financial Contributions' section on page one. This reflects that Outputs 2C and 2D are contingent costs in 2021-22 that will not be incurred at the same time, and that actual costs for the Piper Unit salary component of Output 2c does not reflect true costs to the Commonwealth. For avoidance of doubt, Victoria will not claim, nor be permitted to receive, in excess of

\$6.09 million in 2021-22.

- 6. For the purposes of Output 2C, the milestone payment will include two components:
 - 6.1. the salaries of Piper Unit (or equivalent) staff costs; and
 - 6.2. CDO management costs.
- 7. Piper Unit (or equivalent) staff costs: In calculating a milestone payment for the salaries of Piper Unit (or equivalent) staff costs, the cost to the Commonwealth will be determined as agreed staff costs multiplied by the ratio of Commonwealth CDO/IDO offenders to total offenders housed in the facility. Costs to the Commonwealth for Piper Unit staff costs at Output 2C will be settled in arrears and the maximum recoupable cost in 2021-22 is \$2,175,558.25. Agreed staff costs per commonwealth offender housed are estimated to be as follows:
 - 7.1. If **one offender** is housed in the Piper Unit (or equivalent) during the quarter: \$335,887.70 per quarter (a maximum of \$1,343,550.80 per annum).
 - 7.2. If **two offenders** are housed in the Piper Unit (or equivalent) during the quarter: \$543,889.56 per quarter (a maximum of \$2,175,558.25 per annum).
 - 7.3. If three or four offenders are housed in the Piper Unit (or equivalent) during the quarter: \$618,331.60 per quarter (a maximum of \$2,473,326.38 per annum).
 - 7.4. If **five offenders** to **ten offenders** are housed in the Piper Unit (or equivalent) during the quarter: **\$809,542.56** per quarter (a maximum of **\$3,238,170.25** per annum).
- 8. CDO management costs: includes the costs of sentence management, Major Offender and CV Intelligence Unit staff, training, programs, services and bed costs. These will be paid by the Commonwealth in full on a per CDO offender basis as set out in Output 2C.

Output 2D - CDO housing readiness

- 9. Should the CDO in force at the time of drafting this Schedule cease to be in force in quarter 3 or 4 of 2021-22, and should no other CDO/IDO come into force during that period, the Commonwealth will fund Victoria for the capabilities/staff required to maintain CDO housing readiness. Victoria is not able to claim payment for both Output 2C and 2D in a reporting period.
- Payments for the Piper Unit (or equivalent) staff component of Output 2D will be determined in arrears. Calculation of payment

- assumes one nominal CDO offender as a ratio to the total number of offenders housed in the facility (state and nominal CDO).
- 11. The maximum recoupable cost in 2021-22 is \$1,127,827.86, reflecting two quarters of activity and where there are no state-based offenders housed in the Piper Unit (or equivalent).

Payments for part-period achievements

Subject to the above conditions, where Victoria's achievements against performance milestones for Outputs apply to only part of a quarterly reporting period, Victoria is eligible to claim payment for the entire quarter.
