PROJECT AGREEMENT FOR THE HEALTH INNOVATION FUND --

PART 1 - PRELIMINARIES

- A1 This Schedule has been developed in accordance with clause [12] of the Agreement.
- A2 This Schedule will commence as soon as it is agreed between the Commonwealth and Western Australia and expire on 31 December 2024 or on completion of agreed projects, including final performance reporting.

PART 2 - PROJECTS AND REPORTING

- A3 The following projects will be delivered by Western Australia in 2018 to 2024.
 - (a) Project 1 Acute and Emergency Tele-Psychiatry and Tele-Mental Health use the Emergency Telehealth Service platform to deliver new tele-psychiatry and tele-mental health services in country WA.
 - (b) Project 2 Digital Strategy development of a digital strategy for the WA health system that identifies priorities to support consumers, clinicians and system management.
 - (c) Project 3 Dampier Peninsula Transition to Community Control Transition of two WA Country Health Service (WACHS) Lombadina/Djarindjin and Ardyaloon clinics on the remote Dampier Peninsula; and
 - Initial planning for an Aboriginal Medical Service in Fitzroy Crossing Initial scoping activities for the establishment of a community controlled primary health clinic in Fitzroy Crossing.
