Purpose	The Commonwealth is providing funding to support NSW in delivering the Nap Nap Station Water Efficiency Project (The Project).

	This schedule is approved on the basis that the project and activities identified satisfy s86AD of the Water for the Environment Special Account (in Pt 2AA of the <i>Water Act 2007</i> ).

#### Additional terms

## **Funding**

Total funding from the Commonwealth to NSW under this Schedule will be \$2.39 million with any project costs above this amount to be met by NSW or the project proponent.

New South Wales will ensure all required project approvals are obtained before commencing construction activities including but not limited to;

- Construction activities on Crown land
- Cultural impacts arising from construction
- Environmental impacts arising from construction

NSW will provide interim reports as per the milestones in Table 2 and a final report that includes a financial report containing a statement of payments and receipts in respect of the project.

The final report must be certified by a person undertaking the role of Chief Financial Officer of the Organisation (or a comparable role) and include acquittal of the Nap Nap Station organisation's financial contributions (as per the approved budget), and be supported by a statement that the financial accounts are true and fair.

The final report and final audited financials (including the Nap Nap Station organisation contributions as per the approved budget), will be provided within 30 business days of the project's completion or the expiry of this schedule (whichever occurs first).

### **Project terms**

NSW will be responsible for ensuring that, for the purposes of certifying practical completion, the project will:

- a) Be complete and free from defects or omissions, except for defects or omissions that are minor in nature, that NSW cannot reasonably fix, or by fixing, will significantly inconvenience users of the works;
- b) Not cause any legal or physical impediment to the use of occupation of the property and the works for the designated use; and
- c) Be fit for the designated use.

NSW must ensure all Non Commonwealth in-kind/cash contributions are applied to the project and acquitted in full as per the approved budget.

NSW must transform the Stock and Domestic entitlements into an equivalent high security product (NSW Murrumbidgee) for use by the Commonwealth Environmental Water Holder and provide Nap Nap Station with a new Stock and Domestic Water Access Licence for the revised entitlement volume.

Where there is a shortfall between the actual water saved as a result of the project activities and the volume of water to be returned, NSW or the project proponent must make up this shortfall to ensure that 143.62 ML LTAAY of Murrumbidgee high security water entitlements are transferred to the Commonwealth before 15 December 2023.
