Purpose	This Schedule will support the continued delivery of Murray–Darling Basin water reforms by Basin States through implementation of the Murray–Darling Basin Plan and associated water reform.
	This variation replaces the Schedule executed on 8 April 2022 in order to distribute previously unallocated funding of \$5 million to Basin states for water market reform activities.
	The Schedule also builds on the work already completed or underway by the Basin State Governments under the National Partnership Agreement on Implementing Water Reform in the Murray—Darling Basin which expired on 30 June 2020, and the Implementing Water Reform in the Murray—Darling Basin schedule to the Federation Funding Agreement—Environment which expired on 30 June 2021.

# Estimated financial contributions

The Commonwealth will provide an estimated total financial contribution to the Basin States of up to \$60.0 million in respect of this Schedule.

### Additional terms

Each Basin State will report to the Commonwealth on or before 31 March each funding year on its progress against all milestones and key performance indicators (KPIs) listed in its state table below. Using these reports and any supporting information (including that provided by the Murray–Darling Basin Authority, the Commonwealth Environmental Water Holder and the Inspector-General of Water Compliance), the Commonwealth Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (formerly the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment) (the Department) will assess each Basin State's performance against its KPIs. The assessment against KPIs will be made on a reasonable endeavors basis and a Basin State will not be penalised for action, or lack of action, by another Party. This will be given particular attention where the delivery of a KPI for one Basin State is directly dependent on the completion of an activity that is the responsibility of another Party. The Commonwealth will work closely with Basin States in developing the assessment report.

The Department will advise the Commonwealth Minister with portfolio responsibility for water (the Minister) of its assessment. The Minister will authorise whether payment should be made to each Basin State, based on the funding arrangements set out in Table 1 and having regard to that Basin State's assessment report. In the case of an adverse assessment, the Minister may consider whether or not the adverse assessment is material to that state's cooperation with the reforms.

After payment is authorised, the Department will prepare an annual assessment report for publication on its website, and Basin States will be provided with an opportunity to comment on the draft report before it is finalised.
