Purpose	The Schedule supports Action 12 of the National Teacher Workforce Action Plan: To pilot new approaches to reduce teacher workload through a Workload Reduction Fund to maximise the value of a teacher's time.  This Schedule will initially support the delivery of design of a pilot to reduce teachers' administrative burden through:  1. greater support from additional Education Support Staff to undertake tasks currently taking teacher time that do not require the skills and qualifications of a registered teacher (~ 5 schools); and/or					
	<ol> <li>modernized delivery of templates and forms for individual student planning through modern, cloud-based integrated technology solutions (~100 schools).</li> </ol>					
	Further projects are to be determined by mutual agreement between parties and specified through amendments to this Schedule and accompanied by additional implementation plans.					
	Victoria will make an upfront investment in pilot design, with the initial funds the Commonwealth has made available for 2023-24. During the funded Design phase, Victoria will explore the relative merits and feasibility of the two different Pilot designs described above, both of which are focused on reducing the administrative burden placed on teachers. Victoria will report back to the Commonwealth on the findings of this Design phase, to support high-value co-investment in the Delivery phase from 2024-25, subject to feasibility and efficacy outcomes. The Pilot would be implemented in schools that have student populations at greater disadvantage.

## Role of Victoria

In addition to Clause 20 of the FFA (Role of the States and Territories) Victoria will be responsible for:

- A) Ensuring that in line with the National Teacher Workforce Action Plan, the project(s) are focused on maximising the value of teachers' time and where possible have an emphasis on government schools facing systemic disadvantage and/or assists teachers to support students with diverse needs.
- B) Implementing project(s) in accordance with agreed implementation plans.
- C) Providing reports to the Commonwealth in accordance with Table 2.
- D) Undertaking an evaluation of the impact of the project(s) and providing a copy of the evaluation to the Commonwealth in accordance with Table 2.

Victoria will be required to match the Commonwealth's funding contribution to the project, noting contributions may be provided inkind.
