Implementation Plan

- (2) Project management plans for each project will be finalised after the commencement of this Schedule, as part of an Implementation Plan encompassing all projects.
 - a. The requirements of the Implementation Plan are set out in the Audit and Reporting Framework for the Program, as issued by the Commonwealth and amended from time to time and to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the terms of this Schedule.
- (3) The Implementation Plan will be developed by the Australian Capital Territory and provided to the Commonwealth for endorsement as soon as possible, but no later than three months after the commencement of this Schedule unless otherwise agreed by the Commonwealth.
- (4) Formal commencement of projects cannot occur until the Commonwealth has endorsed the Implementation Plan, in writing.

Performance monitoring and reporting

- (5) The Parties acknowledge that payments under these agreements would usually be tied to the performance milestones at Table 2 below. In lieu of milestone based payments under this agreement, States and Territories commit to honoring the reporting obligations required by this Schedule.
- (6) The frequency and timing of reporting under this Schedule is set out at <u>Table 2: Performance requirements and payment summary</u>
- (7) The content requirements of reporting under this Schedule are set out in the Audit and Reporting Framework for the Program, as issued by the Commonwealth and amended from time to time and to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the terms of this Schedule.

Third parties

- (8) In line with the Program Guidelines, the Australian Capital Territory may engage third parties to support the delivery of projects under this Schedule.
- (9) While third parties are not signatories to this Schedule, the Australian Capital Territory is solely responsible for ensuring third party compliance with the *Disaster Ready Fund Act 2019*, the Disaster Ready Fund Program Guidelines and the terms and conditions of this Schedule.

Repayment of amounts to the Commonwealth

- (10) If efficiencies or overspends are identified, funding may be reallocated to/from other projects under this Program in that jurisdiction with Commonwealth approval, which approval will not be unreasonably withheld.
- (11) In accordance with subsection 21(4) of the Disaster Ready Fund Act 2019, the Commonwealth reserves the right to recover an amount provided under this Schedule, where:

	 a project cannot be delivered in line with the relevant Implementation Plan and the project cannot be appropriately scaled or varied,
	 the Commonwealth and State and Territory cannot reach an agreement on how to reallocate the funds, or
	c. another condition of this Schedule is not met.
(1	2) The Commonwealth will determine on a reasonable basis whether an amount should be repaid, and if so, how much should be repaid, with regard to the circumstances of each matter.
