Duration	This Schedule is expected to expire on 31 December 2026.					
	For the purposes of Clause 10 of the Project Agreement for Pest and Disease Preparedness Programs, this Schedule also expires if the National Management Group (NMG) determines that the Varroa Destructor Response Plan (the Response Plan) should be terminated early. However, in those circumstances this Schedule still allows for the processing of any payments for milestones met up to termination, consistent with cost- sharing and reconciliation obligations under the Emergency Plant Pest Response Deed.					
Purpose	This Schedule will support the delivery of the activities under the National Varroa Destructor Response Plan.					
	On 19 September 2023 NMG agreed that Varroa Destructor was no longer technically feasible to eradicate. The activities under this schedule will also support the transition to management activities that will occur under revised versions of the response plan.					
Project Elements	New South Wales will deliver the actions set out in Varroa Destructor transition to management Response Plan (the Response Plan), which was approved by the NMG on 9 February 2024.					
	The project elements for the Program are:					
	(a) Treatment: The recommended control technique for Varroa mite is destruction of all infected premises of European Honeybees. This will be offered for a limited time following the transition to management plan taking effect.					
	(b) Surveillance activities, undertaken through miticide strips/sticky mats and in some circumstances alcohol wash.					
	(c) Transition to management activities will be undertaken to limit the impacts and slow the spread of varroa mite. The NSW Department of Primary Industries, Australian Honeybee Industry Council and other impacted industry groups will be communicating with beekeepers and businesses relying on pollination services.

		2.1.	Final contributions will be based on actual expenditure and determined by the custodian (Plant Health Australia) in accordance with the EPPRD and the Response Plan.

The Commonwealth's maximum potential payments are set out in the Table 2 milestones but, where applicable, will be adjusted to match the Commonwealth's share of actual expenditure as determined under additional term 2.1. This schedule will be amended in the event that an amount becomes payable to a jurisdiction other than NSW for activities undertaken.

Each Industry Party will subsequently meet its cost sharing obligations to the Commonwealth, arising as a consequence of the Commonwealth meeting Industry Party obligations pursuant to clause 10.4.2, as set out in Part 1 of Schedule 7 of the EPPRD (Section 10.4.3).
×		2.4.	The Commonwealth Minister may, at their discretion, move all or part of an underspend against a milestone in a financial year to a milestone in another financial year. Such a circumstance may arise where the NMG has agreed that the Response Plan can be varied to include additional cost-shared activities, or extend duration, without increasing the overall maximum contribution under this schedule.
