- 1.2 The Department and Victoria will agree to Victoria's proposal to reallocate unspent funding to other projects that meet Program objectives.

2. CVE High Risk Program Coordinator

The Department must be notified in writing if the person fulfilling the role of CVE Program Coordinator changes.

3. Media Engagement

- 3.1 Victoria agrees to consult with and provide forewarning to the Department within ten (10) business days, or earlier dependent upon the urgency of the issue, in the event of any media releases, media engagements or anticipated media coverage relevant to the Program and its participants, current and/or former.
- 3.2 The Department agrees to provide reasonable notice to Victoria of any upcoming relevant Department prepared media releases, media engagements or anticipated media coverage relevant to the Program.

4. Freedom of Information

Victoria must provide the Department notice of any Freedom of Information (FOI) requests in relation to the Program.

5. Ad Hoc

5.1 Victoria agrees to provide additional reports, data or information in relation to the progress or specific activities of the Program where reasonably requested by the Department for reporting purposes, such as Senate Estimates.

6. Evaluation

6.1 Victoria agrees to participate in any evaluations of the Program as commissioned by the Department.
