Duration	This Schedule is expected to expire on 30 June 2024.
Purpose	<p>This Schedule will support the provision of funding for additional, high visibility police, community-based policing through the engagement of Aboriginal Liaison Officers and boost security guard operations in public places in Alice Springs.</p> <p>It is part of a broader two-year \$48.8 million Commonwealth Government investment, announced by Prime Minister Anthony Albanese on 24 January 2023.</p> <p>Additional high visibility police and law enforcement operations, working alongside security guards coupled with the immediate temporary restrictions on alcohol and a move to an opt-out system of alcohol restrictions in Central Australian communities, will act as a circuit breaker to improve community safety in the short to medium term.</p> <p>It will allow high-level visible police operations to continue without affecting general duties patrols, enabling current service levels to be maintained in Alice Springs (i.e. up to three patrols over three shifts, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year).</p> <p>Engagement of Aboriginal Liaison Officers will strengthen relationships between local communities and local police through promoting awareness and education in arising community issues and effectively assist in developing appropriate solutions.</p> <p>The additional resources will ensure NT Police can effectively respond to any surge issues on an ongoing basis, including incidents of community unrest.</p> <p>Specifically, this schedule will provide the Northern Territory with funding for two years for:</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the recruitment, training and deployment of 35 additional FTE police officers in Alice Springs. • the recruitment, training and deployment of 10 additional FTE Aboriginal Liaison Officers in Alice Springs • the equivalent of 10 additional security guards working a 24/7 roster.


