Media and publicity

- 3. As provided for under Clause 21 of the FFA AHCSO, Parties will ensure prior agreement is reached on the nature and content of any events, announcements, promotional material or publicity relating to activities under this Schedule. In addition to this, relevant Parties will:
 - a. Advise the Commonwealth prior to any announcement, promotional material, publicity or signage relevant to the HSP.
 - b. Acknowledge financial contributions, roles, and cooperativeness under this Schedule in any announcement, promotional material, publicity or signage where it is appropriate and relevant.
 - c. Ensure appropriate Commonwealth and state government representatives are invited to participate in any ceremonies, launches or similar events connected a project listed in one of the appendices.

Monitoring, reporting and evaluation

- 4. In addition to Part 4 of the FFA AHCSO, the following reporting requirements also apply:
 - a. The Commonwealth will report on the progress of projects publicly and to the Federal Parliament.
 - b. South Australia will provide, in the format shown at Attachment A, progress reporting in accordance with the milestone schedules at Table A in Appendix A and Table B in Appendix B. The Commonwealth will provide a post completion report template to South Australia.
 - c. Where appropriate, the Commonwealth and South Australia will work together to evaluate the effectiveness of each stream of the HSP against its aims, as well as the effectiveness of projects within the program. The outcomes and impacts of the HSP will in many cases not be known for a number of years after the completion of the program. South Australia will assist in the process of gathering information and conducting evaluation beyond the term of this Schedule.
 - d. South Australia will provide to the Commonwealth six monthly reporting of information it holds and which can reasonably be provided to support the evaluation at Clause 4c, including:
 - i. the net number of residential land parcels created since 1 July 2024, by quarter.
 - ii. the number of residential buildings and the number of residential dwellings approved for development since 1 July 2024, by quarter.

- iii. the number of residential buildings and the number of residential dwellings that have completed construction since 1 July 2024, by quarter.
- e. The reporting under Clause 4d will be agreed by the Parties at the SES Band 1 or equivalent level, and will be submitted no later than:
 - i. 31 August each year, for the previous six-month reporting period of 1 January to 31 May; and
 - ii. 28 February each year, for the previous six-month reporting period of 1 June to 30 November.
- f. South Australia will support the Commonwealth to respond to ad-hoc queries in relation to the HSP which rely on information held by South Australia.
- g. South Australia will notify the Commonwealth as soon as practicable in the event of a likely change to:
 - i. the funding sources for a project, including an increase or decrease in funding;
 - ii. scope, timeframe or cost of a project; or
 - iii. delivery schedule of a project (e.g. due to weather, natural disaster or pandemic impacts).
- h. South Australia will be responsible for receiving, directly from relevant local government authorities, the reporting required in Clause 4b with respect to projects listed in Table A2 in Appendix A and in Table B2 in Appendix B.
- i. Upon receipt, South Australia will be responsible for collating and analysing the regular reporting provided by the local government authorities as required by Clauses 4b, 4h and 4i.
- j. South Australia will notify the Commonwealth should any concerns arise in the duration of managing relevant local government authority funding agreements.

Financial arrangements

- 5. In addition to Part 5 of the FFA AHCSO, the following requirements also apply:
 - a. The Commonwealth contribution for each project is capped at a maximum of \$5 million for HSP1 and a maximum of \$45 million for CEI.
 - b. South Australia will keep separate financial records, or arrange for another organisation to keep separate financial records, for each project listed in an Appendix.

- c. Expenditure above the amount allocated to South Australia on projects delivered through the HSP as per this Schedule will be the responsibility of the respective project proponent.
- d. South Australia will put in place appropriate processes to ensure that payments made under this Schedule are only used for projects listed in the appropriate Appendix.
- e. The Commonwealth will expeditiously work with South Australia to acquit and approve expenditure claims submitted on each project and the Commonwealth agree that South Australia may withhold further payments to a grant recipient on a project until the grant recipient's expenditure claims have been acquitted and approved by the Commonwealth.
- f. Where both Parties agree that a project will not proceed to completion, and funding has already been paid, the most the Commonwealth will contribute is:
 - i. The percentage the Commonwealth agreed to fund for that project, multiplied by the percentage of the total expenditure incurred on that project at that point in time.
 - ii. The total amount the Commonwealth agreed to fund the project; whichever is lower.

Dispute resolution

- 6. Notwithstanding Clause 31 of the FFA AHCSO, the Commonwealth reserves the right to recover an amount provided under this Schedule in accordance with Section 20 of the Federal Financial Relations Act 2009, where funding paid by the Commonwealth for a project to which Clause 5c applies is greater than the amount acquitted by South Australia. South Australia may repay the amount of the overpayment from future HSP payments to South Australia.
- 7. Under the circumstances set out in Clause 6, the Commonwealth will determine on a reasonable basis whether an amount should be repaid, and if so, with regard to the circumstances of each matter, including factors outside of South Australia's control, the relevant Commonwealth Minister may make a determination under section 20 of the Federal Financial Relations Act 2009. Before the Commonwealth exercises a right to recover funds under Clause 7, the Commonwealth will consult with South Australia.
