Purpose	This Schedule is made under the Federation Funding Agreement— Environment (FFA-Environment) which was agreed by the Council of Federal Financial Relations in 2020 as the model for Commonwealth-State funding.
	The Schedule will support the delivery of three (3) New South Wales projects (the Projects) that have been approved streamlined delivery, as part of the Murray-Darling Basin Plan Northern Basin Toolkit Measures (the Toolkit).

	Further context for the Toolkit, and the Projects covered by this Schedule is provided at Attachment A.
	The Projects will be delivered under a staged approach, with project development activities occurring in parallel with some early on-ground works. This approach will facilitate streamlined assessment and delivery, expedite Toolkit funding reaching relevant northern Basin communities, and provide budgetary certainty for the New South Wales government, by setting out the funding envelope approved for the entire life of each of the Projects.
	Further detail on various activities to be completed during each stage of these Projects is outlined in Table 2.

# Estimated financial contributions

The Commonwealth will provide an estimated total financial contribution to New South Wales of up to a maximum amount of \$79,920,000 (GST exclusive) in respect of this Schedule.

## Additional terms

- 1. Project funds must not, unless agreed by the Commonwealth in writing, be used by New South Wales to:
  - a. duplicate a business case or project development activities already undertaken and funded by the Commonwealth; or
  - b. cover the cost of any project activities commenced but not yet completed prior to the execution of this Schedule.
- 2. New South Wales will provide relevant evidence that demonstrates achievement of performance milestones to meet the needs of the Commonwealth. Evidence will be provided in the form of a Project Execution Plan for each Project, that will evolve as New South Wales refines project information (Stage 1).
- 3. Evidence will include, but is not limited to:
  - a. Project Execution Plans (including for Early On-Ground Works) inclusive of:
    - i. Key deliverables
    - Project performance and resourcing including delivery schedule
    - Project costings estimates and forecasts including brief commentary on the derivation of costings data
    - iv. Quality management and assurance
    - v. Risks and issues register
    - vi. Communication and stakeholder engagement planning for the life of the Project

- vii. Governance arrangements.
- Commentary against project expenditure to date, delivery schedule status (including for Early On-Ground Works) and engagement activities undertaken.
- c. Final report for each Project, including lessons learned.
- 4. Project development activities are to:
  - a, be delivered consistent with the agreed Northern Basin Toolkit Project Business Case Assessment Guidelines;
  - include finalised costings for each Project need to be robust and defensible; and
  - include a detailed and scientifically robust monitoring, evaluation and reporting (MER) plan for each of the Projects (see MER plan requirements at Attachment B).
- 5. Once all project development activities have been refined during Stage 1, a fully developed Project Execution Plan will be provided by New South Wales to inform the Gateway Review, or full implementation (Stage 2), for each of these Projects (see also Attachment A).
  - a. A high-level version of this Plan (for Stage 2) will be agreed by the Commonwealth Minister and will outline delivery of all remaining Works (see **Attachment A** for further information).
- 6. To reflect the funding arrangements for the Projects, a governance structure, comprising Commonwealth and New South Wales government officials, will monitor and provide strategic direction on the implementation of Toolkit measures in New South Wales, and oversee the delivery of specified activities and requirements, including endorsement of milestone reports, for each of the Projects under this Schedule.
- 7. Through New South Wales's existing project governance arrangements, New South Wales will notify the Commonwealth should any matters arise, that would inhibit complete and timely delivery of the Project as soon as the state becomes aware of these matters. New South Wales will invite the Commonwealth to participate as an observer in the governance arrangements and will provide monthly project reports to Commonwealth.

- New South Wales will notify the Commonwealth where they intend to make significant variations to the timeframe for delivering milestones agreed in the Project Execution Plan.
- 9. To ensure there is consistency in the approach for the two Fish-friendly Water Extraction projects funded under the Toolkit, New South Wales will ensure regular engagement with Queensland on both screening projects, including sharing lessons learned, and will report back to the Commonwealth on these discussions at each milestone.
- 10. All approved Toolkit projects are designed where possible to employ local and indigenous people, source local goods and improve environmental outcomes in the northern Basin.
- 11. Any assets being constructed or modified by New South Wales as part of these Projects already have existing asset ownership arrangements in place. The Commonwealth will not acquire any assets nor any liability for any operations, maintenance or recurrent costs from works undertaken or associated with these Projects

Funding context and Commonwealth gateway assessment for the Toolkit projects covered by this Schedule.

- On 9 August 2019, Basin First Ministers agreed to implement Toolkit measures through Schedule 3 to the 2013 Intergovernmental Agreement on Implementing Water Reform in the Murray-Darling Basin (the IGA). This includes:
  - a. Up to \$180 million in Commonwealth funding is available until 30 June 2024 for Queensland and New South Wales governments to implement environmental works and measures projects that will deliver improved environmental outcomes the northern Basin, in particular to promote fish or broader ecological health.
  - b. Any ongoing costs related to the approved projects (such as monitoring and evaluation and operation and maintenance costs) will be the responsibility of the relevant State, unless otherwise agreed in relation to individual environmental measures.
- To date, a total of \$5,011,427 has been provided to the Queensland and New South Wales governments for the preparation of Toolkit feasibility proposals.
- 3. In March 2021, following the Commonwealth assessment of the feasibility proposals, the Australian Government announced ten environmental projects that would receive further Toolkit funding, either to commence immediate implementation or to progress to the business case development phase. These ten approved projects were identified by a panel of independent experts to deliver the best environmental outcomes for the northern Basin.
- 4. These Projects have been approved to follow a streamlined gateway model, where the following project activities will happen in parallel as outlined in Table 2:
  - on-ground delivery will commence in 2021 to ensure the benefits are rapidly reaching regional communities,
  - b. further project development activities will be undertaken overtime and submitted in packages to the Commonwealth for rolling assessment as outlined under Purpose of this Schedule.

#### Gateway Review:

- Once all performance milestones for Stage 1 (as set out in Table 2 for each Project) have been met, the suite of project development deliverables will effectively comprise the State's proposal to transition to full implementation (Stage 2) of the Project.
- 6. At this point, the Commonwealth will undertake a "gateway review" to affirm the viability and expected outcomes of each of the Projects, and ensure all information provided by New South Wales meets the Commonwealth's requirements for assessing whether the Project will achieve an outcome which is technically viable, value for money and a proper use of the public resources for which it was originally approved.
- Once this review is complete, and subject to a decision by the Commonwealth Minister, the remainder of the Commonwealth's financial commitment to the Project will be reaffirmed. To enact this decision, a Variation to this Schedule will be agreed by Commonwealth and New South Wales ministers, including agreement of appropriate performance milestones and commensurate milestone payments for the remaining project funding.

Requirement for the Monitoring, Evaluation and Reporting (MER) plan that is to be provided as part of each Toolkit project.

The plan will provide information on how each of the Projects, if implemented, will be assessed to determine its effectiveness in delivering its anticipated environmental outcomes and monitor any key risks and potential ecological dis-benefits. The MER plan must:

- be underpinned by a program logic, and be consistent with long-term watering plans and water resource plans MER, including being informed by risks these plans have identified;
- be a standalone document that addresses relevant MER recommendations identified by the Independent Expert Ecological Panel for Ecological Merit and Prioritisation in their assessment of the project feasibility proposal;
- be capable of evaluating and reporting on the effectiveness of the works, and also whether or not the
  intended environmental outcomes have been achieved by these works. This includes being capable of
  evaluating and reporting on key ecological risks and dis-benefits as part of a risk mitigation strategy
  developed during project development;
- be able to evaluate and report at the project level, but also be geographically and thematically integrated with other relevant MER programs and activities, particularly for other Toolkit projects;
- describe how MER activities leverage off and doesn't duplicate the MER activities undertaken through existing programs;
- describe cost sharing and governance arrangements for longer term MER activities;
- be designed to support broader Basin Plan MER including the Basin-wide monitoring strategy being led by MDBA; and
- describe data sharing arrangements with the expectation being that any data and information arising from the MER plan is available to, and shared with, other Basin governments and also made publicly available where appropriate.

- any planned longer-term monitoring, evaluation and reporting activities which may provide evidence
  of changes in the numbers of native fish retained in the rivers.
