Purpose	This Schedule will support the delivery of the "Tasmanian high soil carbon landscapes – improving soil, climate, ecosystem and traditional knowledge project" (the Project) under the Partnering to Implement the National Soil Action Plan 2023-28 program (Action Plan) in Tasmania.						
	This project will improve knowledge of Tasmanian High Soil Carbon Landscapes within both agricultural and conservation landscapes by identifying their location and threats and quantifying their carbon capital. It will identify monitoring priorities, integrate Tasmanian Aboriginal knowledge and cultural significance, and develop spatial outputs and land management guidelines to help sustainably manage these carbon assets. The improved knowledge will also inform climate change calculations and mitigation strategies and have input to fire management. Capacity building will occur through appointment of early career trainees/graduates and skills development for technical staff.						
	The Project will contribute to progress on the Action Plan through clear, measurable commitments to localised action. They will provide significant contributions to facilitate the delivery of priority actions 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Action Plan, namely:						
	 Develop an agreed national framework to support the measurement, monitoring, mapping, reporting and sharing of soil state and trend information, to inform best practice management, decision making and future investment in soil. 						
	 Partner to develop a holistic policy and strategy approach where soil function is recognised, valued, and protected for the environment, economy, food, infrastructure, health, biodiversity, and communities. 						
	 Accelerate the adoption of land use and management practices that protect soil and improve soil state and trend.

	4. The State of Tasmania agrees to work co-operatively with the Commonwealth to share Soil Data for the Commonwealth Purposes, where it can be done securely, safely, lawfully and ethically.							
	5. The State of Tasmania grants the Commonwealth a permanent, irrevocable, royalty-free, licence fee-free, world-wide, non-exclusive licence (including a right to sub-licence) to collect, use, interrogate, reproduce, modify, adapt, publish, communicate and distribute, the							

Intellectual Property Rights in the Soil Data for a Commonwealth Purpose, all of which are non-commercial purposes.

6. In clauses 4 and 5:

- a. Commonwealth Purpose means:
 - i. using Soil Data for any purpose connected to the Commonwealth's policies for valuing, managing and improving Australia's soil assets;
 - ii. accessing and use of georeferencing information contained in that Soil Data, subject to, in unique and/or rare cases, all relevant permissions having been obtained and to any limitations imposed under the Natural Values Atlas data sharing policies and procedures, for Commonwealth and State government research and policy development, and for nongovernment research approved by the Commonwealth;
 - iii. providing access to Soil Data held in the Natural Values Atlas through the Australian National Soil Information System or any successor or related soil information system; and
 - iv. combining the Soil Data with any third-party data to form an aggregate Commonwealth database which is licenced to third parties.
- b. Intellectual Property Rights means any intellectual property rights owned by the State of Tasmania, whether registered or unregistered and includes copyright, designs, patents, trademarks, semi-conductor and circuit layout rights and excludes moral rights as defined in the Copyright Act 1968 (Cwth).

c. Soil Data means:

- i. the soil test data collected by the State of Tasmania or a contractor appointed by the State of Tasmania which has been collected specifically for the purpose of the Project;
- ii. the georeferencing information relevant to the tested soil samples referred to in i. above, other than georeferencing information that has not been authorised to be or which cannot lawfully be released; and
- iii. qualitative or contextual information collected from a landholder relevant to the tested soil samples referred to in i. above, other than information that has not been authorised to be or which cannot lawfully be released.
