Purpose	This Schedule will support the delivery of two projects (the Projects) under the Partnering to Implement the National Soil Action Plan 2023-28 (Action Plan) program in Western Australia:
	 a. Know Your Southern Soils (South Coast), Western Australia: to grow contemporary soil knowledge, drive the adoption of improved soil management practices, and position soil to be part of a regional natural capital accounts initiative across the South Coast hinterland between Albany and Esperance. There are three interlinked modules – soil assessment and data collection, engagement and extension, and soil workforce training. b. Soils - New Horizons: to promote and normalise widespread soil sampling by growers, and interpretation of soil data against national benchmarks, to enhance on-farm nutrient use efficiency and reduce eutrophication risks. The focus will be on broadacre
	grazing in areas with greater than 550mm annual rainfall. The Projects will contribute to progress on the Action Plan through clear, measurable commitments to localised action. They will provide significant contributions to facilitate the delivery of priority action 1, and deliver on priority actions 2, 3 and 4, of the Action Plan, namely:
	 Develop an agreed national framework to support the measurement, monitoring, mapping, reporting and sharing of soil state and trend information, to inform best practice management, decision making and future investment in soil.
	 Partner to develop a holistic policy and strategy approach where soil function is recognised, valued, and protected for the environment, economy, food, infrastructure, health, biodiversity, and communities.

- 4. The State must obtain for the Commonwealth a permanent, irrevocable, royalty-free, licence fee-free, world-wide, non-exclusive licence (including a right to sub-licence) to collect, use, interrogate, reproduce, modify, adapt, publish, perform, broadcast, communicate, distribute, commercialise and exploit the Intellectual Property Rights in Soil Data for a Commonwealth Purpose.
- 5. For the purpose of clause 4:
 - a. Commonwealth Purpose means:
 - i. using Soil Data for any purpose connected to the Commonwealth's policies for valuing, managing and improving Australia's soil assets;
 - ii. accessing and using of georeferencing information contained in that Soil Data for government and non-government research and policy development;
 - iii. uploading that Soil Data to a managed database and made available to the Australian National Soil Information System or any successor or related database; and
 - iv. combining the Soil Data with any third-party data to form an aggregate database which is licenced to third parties.
 - Intellectual Property Rights means any intellectual property rights, whether registered or unregistered and includes copyright, designs, patents, trademarks, semi-conductor and circuit layout rights.
 - c. Soil Data includes:
 - i. the soil test data from the soil testing undertaken by a person;
 - ii. the georeferencing information relevant to the tested soil samples; and
 - iii. any qualitative or contextual information collected from the landholder relevant to the tested soil samples

but excludes any data or information in relation to soil testing or soil testing samples which is:

- iv. subject to existing, or reasonably anticipated, actions or litigation involving the State or its agencies (including those instigated under the Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945 or the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972) where disclosure could reasonably cause harm or prejudice to the conduct of those proceedings;
- v. subject to any privacy or confidentiality laws which may prevent its public disclosure; or

vi. deemed highly sensitive where disclosure could reasonably prejudice the proper functioning of the government of the State.

For purposes of transparency, the State will, to the extent possible, provide excluded data or information to the Commonwealth on a confidential basis but such data or information will not be 'Soil Data' for the purpose of the licence referred to in clause 4.

Moral Rights

- To the extent reasonably practicable, the Commonwealth will attribute authorship of all works that are provided under this Schedule.
 - a. The State will provide the Commonwealth with all necessary information to facilitate such the attribution of authorship of works that are provided under this Schedule.
 - b. If the Commonwealth requires any moral rights consents, the State will provide all reasonable assistance to enable the Commonwealth to obtain consent from the author of the work. Unless otherwise agreed, the State will not be required to obtain the consent from the author for the Commonwealth.
