Purpose	This schedule will support delivery of the Shorebird and Wetland Habitat Project in South Australia (the Project).				
	The activities funded under this schedule will deliver on-ground solutions to improve these vital habitats. Funding will be provided to South Australia to:				
	<ul> <li>Confirm and prioritise feasible wetland sites</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>Develop a Project Implementation Plan, including site and management plans</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>Establish delivery partnerships with, for example, First Nations, private landholders, Landscape Boards, and the National Parks and Wildlife Service</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>Deliver a range of on-ground works to improve wetlands, flow connectivity, and water management capabilities at priority wetland sites, enhancing the quality and availability of shorebirds and wetland habitat.</li> </ul>				
	Key activities will include:				
	<ul> <li>Construction of wetland management infrastructure to manage water levels, improving the extent, quality, and duration of inundation at priority sites</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>Habitat protection or restoration efforts to enhance existing ecosystems</li> </ul>

Additional terms	South Australia will provide Annual Work Plans as described in <u>Attachment A</u> , to the Commonwealth for acceptance by 30 April of each year. The Annual Work Plan will outline the expected activities to be undertaken in the upcoming financial year.					

South Australia will be responsible for ensuring that the project will:

- be complete and free from defects or omissions, except for defects or omissions that are minor in nature, that South Australia cannot reasonably fix, or by fixing, will significantly inconvenience users of the works.
- Not knowingly cause any legal or physical impediment to the use of occupation of the property and the works for the designated use.
- Be fit for the designated use.
