	 Monitoring and responding to current distributions of Aedes albopictus in the Torres Strait region.
	 Applying, developing, and evaluating best-practice control tools to prevent the expansion of Aedes albopictus beyond the Torres Strait.
	 Increasing stakeholder activity in controlling container-breeding mosquitoes in the region through organisations such as the Torres Strait Council, which will raise community awareness and mobilisation and organise clean-up campaigns.

- 4. Collaborating with a range of partners to improve knowledge in the Torres Strait and Northern Peninsula Area regarding the prevention of mosquito-borne diseases including the Environmental Health and Vector Control section of the Torres and Cape Hospital and Health Services, the Northern Peninsula Area Regional Council and the local newspaper, Torres News.
- Eliminating Aedes albopictus when detected inside the "cordon sanitaire" area (Thursday Island and Horn Island) or on the mainland.

Queensland will provide annual performance reports, at the times specified in Table 2, that contain a description of actual performance and information that demonstrates achievement of the outputs and describes activities by Queensland in the period to date against the project milestones. This may include relevant statistics for surveillance, control and elimination and any indication of changes to the local capacity for vector management. Each report is to include details of any matter(s) that have arisen which could adversely impact on the delivery of the output, and how Queensland proposes to resolve this/these matter(s). The high-level evaluation report shall include the above reporting requirements as well as a description of lessons learned, benefits, and outcomes of the activities delivered over 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2028.

The Parties agree and commit to participating in Biannual Teleconferences in the last week of May and November each year, until the completion of this Schedule, to discuss progress and identify any arising issues.
