Purpose	This Schedule will support the Commonwealth disbursement of financial assistance to the Northern Territory for the implementation of the National Firearms Register (NFR).			
	Responsibility for firearms management in Australia is shared between the Commonwealth and state and territory governments (States).			
	The Commonwealth is responsible for matters relating to the import and export of firearms, while States have responsibility for all matters relating to licensing, possession, transfer, storage, registration and use of firearms.			
	The National Firearms Agreement provides guiding principles for the management of firearms access and firearms ownership in Australia.			
	The NFR will provide a mechanism to share high quality, reliable firearms and firearms ownership information between Australian jurisdictions to ensure that police and other law enforcement agencies have the tools they need to keep themselves and the community safe.			
	In order to establish this national capability to the benefit of all Australians, significant reform to firearms management is required across all Australian jurisdictions.			
	In entering into this Agreement, the Commonwealth and the Northern Territory recognise that a coordinated and cohesive approach to firearms information management is required in order to limit the risks posed by firearms to the Australian community, particularly frontline law enforcement.			

Estimated financial contributions

The Commonwealth will provide an estimated total financial contribution to the States of \$101.8m in respect of this Schedule.

Additional terms

Allocation of Funds

- 1. The Parties understand that this Schedule is made in good faith and that funding will be apportioned to projects as shown at Table 2.
- 2. In the case where there are significant adverse changes to the scope, scale or cost of the Register's implementation, the relevant State portfolio minister may write to the Commonwealth to request further consideration.

NFR Program Responsibilities

- 3. The Commonwealth will be responsible for:
 - a. leading the national policy approach and program coordination for the implementation of the NFR
 - b. building and operating the central Register in line with agreed business requirements and as a National Policing Information System under the *Australian Crime Commission Act 2002* and
 - c. uplifting its portals and systems related to firearms management to meet the requirements of the NFR.
- 4. Each State will be responsible for:
 - a. Leading the policy response and approach within its jurisdiction and
 - b. Uplifting their firearms registries, portals and systems to meet the requirements of the NFR.

Governance

- 5. The Commonwealth will be responsible for setting up the governance structure, with the appropriate for and reporting mechanisms, to support the implementation of the NFR.
- 6. States will be responsible for participating in the governance structure.

Procurement

- 7. If required, the Commonwealth will assist States, to develop procurement strategies to acquire the most appropriate firearms registry platform, including any joint or coordinated procurement.
- 8. A joint procurement may constitute a significant change and a new agreement may be needed the Commonwealth will work with affected parties where required.

Legislation and Regulation

- g. The Commonwealth will work with States to coordinate the necessary legislative and regulatory changes needed to enable the NFR to meet its stated objectives.
- 10. States will be responsible for managing their respective legislative change process in line with NFR timeframes.

Performance monitoring and reporting

- 11. The Commonwealth will work with States to monitor progress in accordance with implementation plans.
- 12. States will be responsible for developing a detailed implementation plan for jurisdictional level activities.
- 13. The Commonwealth may provide an implementation plan and progress report templates to be used to assist States to meet reporting requirements under the FFA.
- 14. In consultation with States, the Commonwealth will report to relevant forums including the Police Ministers Council.
