Purpose	<p>This Schedule will support the delivery of improved detection, monitoring, and management of acute rheumatic fever (ARF) and rheumatic heart disease (RHD) in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians through coordinated disease register and control programs. This Agreement will support a collaborative effort between the Commonwealth and States for delivery of the Rheumatic Fever Strategy (RFS).</p> <p>This Agreement embodies the principles of the <i>National Agreement on Closing the Gap</i> to achieve genuine and mutually respectful partnership between governments and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.
