This Schedule has been amended for the Commonwealth to provide an additional \$33 million financial contribution to the States in the 2021 – 2022 financial year.  This amended Schedule now also includes New South Wales, Tasmania and the Northern Territory as Parties.

## Table 2 Appendix A - Project Eligibility Criteria

Guldance to the State of Western Australia on eligibility for Commonwealth funding under the Horticultural Netting Program.

- The State of Western Australia will make available a total pool of \$4,665,277 for payments to eligible primary producers.
- 2. The State of Western Australia will retain \$135,000 from the State's \$4,800,277 allocation for its cost of administering the funding.
- 3. Payments to eligible primary producers will be up to 50 per cent of the costs incurred by primary producers, up to a maximum of \$300,000, for eligible activities undertaken from 16 December 2019 for apple and pear growers, and from 14 December 2021 for all other horticultural crop growers.
  - a) The State of Western Australia may choose to lower the maximum amount of payments to eligible primary producers.

## 4. Eligible applicants must:

- a) Be registered with the Australian Taxation Office as a primary production business and have an Australian Business Number;
- b) Be property owners, share farmers or lease holders in the horticulture industry;
- c) Purchase and install protective netting over existing commercial horticultural produce;
- d) Earn more than 50 percent of their total income from primary production.
- 5. The land on which netting is to be installed must have an established use of horticultural production prior to 16 December 2019 for apple and pear crops, and prior to 14 December 2021 for all other horticultural crops.
- 6. The protective netting must be purchased and installed to increase horticultural productivity, by reducing the impacts of adverse weather events or animal predation, and to reduce water usage,
- 7. Protective netting must be purchased and installed after 16 December 2019 for apple and pear crops and after 14 December 2021 for all other horticultural crops.
- 8. Eligibility for the payment applies to the purchase and installation of permanent and throw-over protective netting and associated support structures.
- Grower co-contributions may include funds provided through loans from the Commonwealth Regional Investment Corporation.
- 10. To ensure the greatest value for the Program, the following activities are ineligible for funding:
  - a) Projects that have already received assistance from State or Commonwealth grants to achieve the same objectives;
  - b) Projects where the netting and/or associated support structures have been damaged by the bushfires of 2019-20;
  - c) Projects where insurance has been claimed for damaged netting and/or associated support structures;

- d) Retrospective funding for purchase or works carried out prior to 16 December 2019 for apple and pear crops and/or 14 December 2021 for all other horticultural crops;
- e) Feasibility studies, business cases, reports and development plans;
- f) Costs associated with preparing applications for funding;
- g) Operational expenditure, including wages, utilities, self-installation, repairs and maintenance;
- h) Grapes grown for the purposes of viticulture.
- 11. All funding is to be contracted by the State of Western Australia by 30 June 2024 with completion of all works to be finalised by, and payments made to grantees by, 30 June 2025.
- 12. It is requested that the State of Western Australia consult with the horticulture industry in that State in developing program guidelines.
