Duration	This Schedule is expected to expire on 30 June 2027.
Purpose	<p>This Schedule will support the delivery of the Murray–Darling Basin Telemetry Uplift Program (the Program).</p> <p>The program will increase the coverage of metering telemetry across the Murray–Darling Basin.</p> <p>Telemetry is an important tool for governments to quickly monitor water taken from the Basin. The data generated by these devices will improve compliance, improve oversight for the growing water market, and provide regulators and water users with timely information to manage water and rivers.</p> <p>Greater telemetry coverage is recommended in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The <i>Murray-Darling Basin Water Markets Inquiry</i>, which was published by the ACCC in 2021. Recommendation 17 refers. • The <i>Water Market Reform: Final Roadmap Report</i>, which was written by Daryl Quinlivan AO and delivered to the Australian Government in 2022. Recommendation 20 refers.

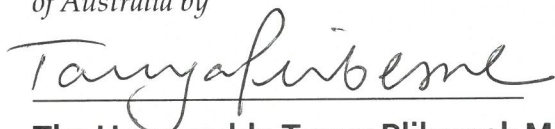
