The first generation of the app, 'Pave', was released in February 2025 by the Cancer Institute NSW. The application will provide accessible			
	cessation services dedicated to young people and tailors traditional support services to meet the preferences of young people. A key priority of the National Tobacco Strategy 2023-2030 is to provide greater access to cessation services to support people to quit the use of tobacco and e-cigarettes/vapes. New South Wales is responsible for:

- delivering a national vaping cessation application that:
 - o supports the needs and preferences of young people to access support
 - o is accessible to all young people across Australia aged 14-24 years who have a suitable digital device
 - is operational across both the Apple and Android platforms
 - meets relevant privacy and security requirements under Australian law
 - supports First Nations people and people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds in accessing culturally safe support.
- the ongoing application maintenance, administration support, technical/IT support and data management required to support user accessibility across jurisdictions
- the development and implementation of new features and tools within the application to support youth vaping cessation.
 Additional features to be informed by consultation with young people, as part of the application's ongoing review and development
- developing a dataset to capture relevant information on use. The dataset should allow for (at a minimum but not limited to) reporting of data disaggregated by:
 - demographic data, where possible and in line with privacy laws
 - including gender; age; geographic location by postcode; smoker/vaper and
 - based on the results of consultation with young people, the dataset may include priority population identification – such as Aboriginal or Torres Strait

Islander people, LGBTIQA+ people and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Groups

- data on use of tobacco and vaping products and other non-therapeutic nicotine products such as nicotine pouches, and if feasible; dual/multi use of nicotine products and quit attempts
- data on the usage of the application including frequency of use and use in each jurisdiction
- appropriately acknowledging the funding provided by the Commonwealth in the app, app stores and other relevant materials.

The Commonwealth is responsible for:

- sharing information on upcoming national tobacco and e-cigarette campaigns with NSW
- sharing information about the app with other jurisdictions by using pre-existing governance arrangements such inter-jurisdictional governance arrangements for tobacco and e-cigarette control.
