- (4) The Implementation Plan will be developed by Western Australia and provided to the Commonwealth for endorsement as soon as possible, but no later than three months after the commencement of this Schedule unless otherwise agreed by the Commonwealth.
- (5) Western Australia and the Commonwealth may mutually agree to substitute projects that align with the program objectives or compliment the original commitment.

### Performance monitoring and reporting

- (6) The Parties acknowledge that payments under this agreement will be tied to the performance milestones at <u>Table 2 Performance</u> requirements and payment summary.
- (7) The frequency and timing of reporting under this Schedule is set out at <u>Table 2: Performance requirements and payment summary</u>.
- (8) The content requirements of reporting under this Schedule are set out in the Assurance and Reporting Framework for the Program, as issued by the Commonwealth and amended from time to time and to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the terms of this Schedule.

#### Reporting

- (9) Throughout the project period, the Commonwealth may ask Western Australia for ad-hoc reports, including but not limited to interim reports, details of media events, information requests from the Commonwealth Minister and meetings to discuss the project implementation.
- (10) The Commonwealth may request financial declarations, requesting Western Australia to provide a declaration that the funding was spent in accordance with the funding agreement and to report on any underspend of the funding.

## Third parties

- (11) Western Australia may engage third parties to support the delivery of projects under this Schedule.
- (12) While third parties are not signatories to this Schedule, Western Australia is responsible for ensuring third party compliance with the terms and conditions of this Schedule.
