Duration	This Schedule is expected to expire on 31 December 2029.
Purpose	This Schedule's purpose is to deliver Phase 3A of the Rum Jungle Rehabilitation Project (Stage 3) (the Project). Successful completion of Phase 3A will contribute to the Project's Stage 3 objectives including environmental rehabilitation; restoration of Traditional Owners' cultural value of the land; and setting the conditions for enabling the potential resolution of the Finniss River Land Claim. The Schedule furthers work already funded by the Commonwealth
	Government and delivered by the Northern Territory Government under previous stages of the Project. To date, the Project has consisted of three stages with various substages and phases, leading to a total of 5 distinct phases across the Project's delivery. Details on previous stages can be found on the Federal Financial Relations website (federalfinancialrelations.gov.au).
Estimated financial contributions	Commonwealth financial contributions to the Northern Territory are not for publication (nfp) to ensure tender processes are competitive and provide governments value for money. The Commonwealth's financial contribution will be progressively published following execution of the Project's major contracts. The Commonwealth will commit funding at the agreed P80¹ level (Estimated National Partnership Payments) and will initially release funding at the Estimated agreed level outlined in the table below (Table
	1a).

¹ P80 refers to a confidence level regarding the probability of the cost not being exceeded. That is, P80 is a cost that will not be exceeded 80% of the time.

Additional Terms

Governance

Both parties agree that Project Governance is a joint responsibility of the Commonwealth and Northern Territory governments.

A governance arrangement will be agreed between the Parties and codified through a *Project Governance Framework*.

Provision of Commonwealth Funding

Provision of funding to the Northern Territory for Rum Jungle's rehabilitation is voluntary and is not an acknowledgement that the Commonwealth's past actions have contributed to ongoing environmental and cultural impacts.

For the purposes of releasing Commonwealth funding to the Northern Territory, the Commonwealth will assess and verify achievement of performance benchmarks and milestones in accordance with the *Project Assurance Plan*.

The Commonwealth commitment is contingent on the following:

- a. Milestones being assessed as completed by the Commonwealth in accordance with the *Project Assurance Plan*.
- b. The Northern Territory participating and maintaining governance arrangements and undertaking and/or participating in regular reviews to ensure governance is contemporary and fit for purpose, as agreed in the *Project Governance Framework*.
- c. The Northern Territory continuing to effectively engage and manage risks to the Project including risks relating to budget, schedule, scope, environmental, quality, stakeholder engagement and procurement as detailed in the *Project Management Plan*.

d. Both Parties contributing to the functioning and operation of the Rum Jungle Project Board, which operates as outlined in the Rum Jungle Project Board Terms of Reference.

Increases in Project Costs

The Parties agree that where there is a cost increase for the Project above the agreed level, any additional funding up to the agreed P8o level will only be released on a demonstrated needs basis, agreed in writing by Commonwealth and Northern Territory Portfolio Ministers.

Project Cost Savings

Notwithstanding Clause 31 of the Federation Funding Agreement – Environment, where the Northern Territory has a reported underspend, the Commonwealth and Northern Territory Portfolio Ministers agree that funds will be re-invested into additional rehabilitation activities, either within Phase 3A or future-phase scope items. The Commonwealth and Northern Territory Portfolio Ministers will agree in writing when and how reinvestment in the above activities is achieved.

Payment of Milestones

Payments made at each milestone will be equal to the cost of claimed activities over the milestone reporting period as per Attachment 1. Each activity in Attachment 1 can only be claimed once under this schedule. Payment claims in a given financial year will only be accepted up to the Agreed Level Commonwealth Contribution, unless cost escalation necessitates release of funding up to the P8o Level (subject to agreement in writing by Commonwealth and Northern Territory Portfolio Ministers).

Roles and Responsibilities

In addition to Clause 19 of the FFA – Environment, the Commonwealth will be responsible for

- a. Assuring the Project including verification of Project delivery activities and reviewing Project risk.
- b. Ensuring required government processes are completed to support delivery of future phases of the Project.
- c. Supporting the Northern Territory in stakeholder engagement through participation in Project governance and provision of advice and relevant case studies.

In addition to Clause 20 of the FFA – Environment, the Northern Territory will be responsible for:

- a. Providing an in-kind contribution to support the implementation of this Schedule.
- b. Ensuring that all necessary approvals for Project delivery are in place and conditions are met.

- c. Ensuring that, with sufficient notice and conformation to relevant work safe requirements, the Commonwealth and its contractors involved in the Project have the required access to the Project site to fulfill their respective roles and responsibilities.
- d. Leading stakeholder engagement, including engaging affected Traditional Owners and stakeholders, including affected parties under the Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976 (Commonwealth), the Northern Land Council (NLC), relevant government agencies and the local community, to contribute to delivery of the Project. Engagement of Traditional Owners by the Parties does not supplant any statutory requirement of the NLC under the Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976 (Commonwealth).
- e. Leading delivery of Project benefits.

In Addition to Clause 21 of the FFA – Environment, the Parties will share responsibility for:

- a. Developing, implementing, engaging and reviewing Project governance arrangements
- b. Ensuring all aspects of the Project deliver value for money for public funds and support the longer term capacity and diversity of the market.
- c. Supporting the functioning and operation of the Rum Jungle Project Board, which operates as outlined in the *Rum Jungle Project Board Terms of Reference*.
- d. Reporting to the Rum Jungle Project Board in advance of undertakings or activities which could have a material impact on the Project's objectives or scope, including entering of significant contracts or approaches to market for major works.
- e. Ensuring both parties share and receive necessary information to conduct their respective roles, including ongoing transparency with regards to budget, assurance, risk and government processes.

Additional Requirements

In addition to the roles and responsibilities listed above, both parties agree the following requirements.

The Commonwealth agrees to:

a. Seek independent assurance advice to support Project delivery confidence for the Commonwealth and Northern Territory.

- b. Seek independent Project advice to support Project delivery confidence for the Commonwealth and Rum Jungle Project Board, as deemed necessary by the Rum Jungle Project Board and relevant Commonwealth agencies.
- c. Develop a detailed business case and cost estimate for the next phase of work following Phase 3a, in consultation with the Northern Territory.

The Northern Territory agrees to:

- a. Provide data on the Rum Jungle Rehabilitation Project for inclusion in the *Commonwealth Closing the Gap Annual Report and Implementation Plan*² as outlined in the reporting requirements at Attachments 2 and 3.
- b. Provide notice to the Commonwealth within 10 business days of becoming aware of an actual or anticipated failure to achieve a milestone activity by the timing proposed in the *Schedule of Activity* (Attachment 1) and/or *Project Management Plan*. The notice should include an outline of the reasoning behind the delay, proposed remedy, and expected completion date of the milestone activity.
- c. Provide the Commonwealth with work, scope and cost information of future rehabilitation phases to assist the development of the detailed business case and cost estimate.

Interpretation

For the purpose of this Schedule, the land subject to rehabilitation under Phase 3A are:

- a. Mt Burton, the area of land identified as Section 998 Hundred of Goyder.
- b. Mt Fitch, the land within NT Portion 3283, Crown Lease Perpetual 862.
- c. Rum Jungle, the area of land identified as Section 2968, Hundred of Goyder.

For the purpose of this Schedule:

- a. 'Australian Industry Participation Plan' (AIP Plan) means a written plan that is required under the Australian Jobs Act 2013 (Commonwealth).
- b. 'Coomalie Community Government Council' means the Coomalie Local Government Area (LGA) which is situated south of Darwin, Palmerston and Litchfield LGAs. The Council's area is 2,056 km².

- c. 'Income Support Participants' (ISP) include those persons receiving income support payments under, but not limited to, the Community Development Program (CDP), Workforce Australia, Vocational Training and Education Centres (VTEC) and Transition to Work (TtW).
- d. 'Aboriginal Participation Plan' (APP) means a written plan based on the targets and relevant frameworks under of the National Agreement on Closing the Gap.

Traditional Aboriginal Owners

Both the Commonwealth and Northern Territory Governments acknowledge the Aboriginal Land Commissioner's 1981 recommendation to grant Aboriginal land including the former Rum Jungle Mine site to its Traditional Owners, the Kungarakan and Warai peoples.

The Kungarakan and Warai peoples are to be consulted on rehabilitation planning and maintenance matters, as both governments acknowledge their desire that rehabilitation at the former Rum Jungle Mine site allows for beneficial land and water access and use.

There are also Traditional Owners and other community groups along the length of the Finniss River, downstream of the former Rum Jungle Mine site. These groups value, access and use the Finniss River.

Attachment 1

Schedule of Activity

This schedule contains discrete milestone activities to achieve the scope of Phase 3A:

- Drainage of the Main Pit and confirmation of the suitability of the dry backfill methodology;
- Ground water treatment plant construction and groundwater treatment commencement;
- Pit water treatment plant construction to manage pit and surface water;
- Intermediate waste rock dump (WRD) excavated and materials placed in main pit;
- Dysons waste rock dump and backfilled pit excavated and placed in main pit;
- 36% (by volume) of main waste rock dump excavated and placed in the main pit; and
- Main Pit backfill completed and capped; and Final target landform for the Main Pit achieved.

At its conclusion, this phase is expected to deliver the following end state:

- Water Treatment Plants operational and treating groundwater;
- Main Pit backfilled and capped;
- Intermediate WRD rehabilitated; and
- Dyson's (backfill) rehabilitated.

The Commonwealth will release payment for individual activities as they are completed and claimed by the Northern Territory, outlined in Table 2 above.

The dates in the schedule below are indicative and further measurable details of activities are in the Project Management Plan.

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Quarterly Milestone Report
