Duration	This Schedule is expected to expire on 30 June 2027.		
Purpose	This Schedule provides funding to South Australia over three years from 2024-25 to deliver the next phase of the Port Augusta Community Safety and Wellbeing Plan.		
	The key deliverables for this funding are specifically related to the Port Augusta and Davenport Community Alliance Group (The Alliance) to support the Port Augusta Community Safety and Wellbeing Plan and to assist with community led identification of priority actions, linked to the funding the Partnership will also be accountable for establishing monitoring and evaluation outcomes.		
	The Alliance is composed of representatives from Traditional Owner groups, community members, leadership from key Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations, business, youth groups and representatives from the Commonwealth and South Australian (SA) Government.		
	The Port Augusta Safety and Wellbeing Partnership (The Partnership) will be established between the Commonwealth and SA Government to focus on the safety and wellbeing of the people in Port Augusta across a range of areas including community safety, social inclusion, education, health, community justice, housing, human services outreach, and youth programs. The Partnership will support the work of the Alliance and coordinate data across programs funded by local, state and federal governments to map services, improve coordination and identify potential areas for extended or new funding.		

Estimated financial contributions	The Commonwealth will provide a total financial contribution to the SA Government of \$6.0 million over 2 years from 2024-25 in respect of this Schedule. The SA Government will provide a financial co-contribution of 50% matched funding to support the delivery of projects identified in this Schedule. Details on the Commonwealth and South Australia estimated financial contributions for the implementation of this Schedule are set in the table below.

A clear set of Performance indicators will be led by the Partnership to evaluate the success of the Partnership.

Performance indicators should be meaningful, simple, and comprehensible to the public. Indicators should be limited to those necessary to measure performance and inform the public about progress of initiatives or other outputs.
