	Any further projects are to be determined by mutual agreement between parties and specified through amendments to this Schedule and accompanied by additional implementation plans.
	Maximising Time to Teach
	The Maximising Time to Teach pilot will reduce teacher workloads by making high-quality curriculum materials available for teachers to use, including instructional materials and assessments.
	The focus of the curriculum materials will be on English and/or STEM subjects (excluding Mathematics) and the resources will not duplicate material available through existing initiatives (such as the suite of Teacher Resource Hubs being delivered by Education Services Australia to reduce teachers' lesson preparation workload).
	All materials produced as part of the Maximising Time to Teach pilot wi align with the Australian Curriculum Version 9.0 and be made freely available online to all teachers across all sectors and all jurisdictions for minimum of three years.

- D) Undertaking an evaluation of the impact of the project(s) and providing a copy of the evaluation to the Commonwealth in accordance with Table 2.

Tasmania will be required to match the Commonwealth's funding contribution to the project(s), noting contributions may be provided inkind.
