	Design of a pilot to reduce teachers' administrative burden				
	Victoria will explore the relative merits and feasibility of the two different pilot designs described above ('Education Support Staff' and 'Cloud-based integrated technology solutions'), both of which are focused on reducing the administrative burden placed on teachers. Victoria will report back to the Commonwealth on the findings of this design phase through a Progress Report.				

## **Operational Teaching Assistants pilot**

Victoria will implement an Operational Teaching Assistants pilot, which will trial new teaching assistant roles in schools. The Operational Teaching Assistants pilot will be informed by the 'Education Support Staff' pilot feasibility study completed as part of the 'Design of a pilot to reduce teachers' administrative burden' project.

The Operational Teaching Assistants pilot will trial new roles in schools to ease the administrative load on teachers and support teachers to focus on core teaching activities that require their professional skills and judgement. Over two years, from Term 3 2025 to Term 2 2027, a total of approximately 40 Operational Teaching Assistants will be employed in Victorian government and non-government schools as part of the pilot. Operational Teaching Assistants will be strategically deployed to maximise the workload reduction of teachers across 15 to 30 schools.

Approximately 70 per cent of the Operational Teaching Assistant roles will be allocated to Victorian government schools, and approximately 30 per cent to Victorian non-government schools.

The overwhelming majority (approximately 95 per cent) of funding for the Operational Teaching Assistants pilot, being the funding set out in Table 1B, will go towards salaries (and associated oncosts) associated with employing Operational Teaching Assistants.

Estimated financial contributions

The Commonwealth will provide an estimated total financial contribution to Victoria of \$4.25m in respect of this Schedule.
