	<ul> <li>Support long-term job creation and a more highly skilled workforce in the Australian recycling industry</li> </ul>

# Estimated financial contributions

The Commonwealth will provide a maximum estimated total financial contribution of \$6,353,705 to New South Wales in respect of this Schedule. All payments are GST exclusive.

The estimated financial contribution to be provided by the Commonwealth is outlined in Table 1.

Note: Table 1 includes contributions from the Commonwealth (\$6.354 million) and New South Wales (\$1.000 million) but does not include contributions from the Project Proponent.

## Additional terms

#### Financial contributions

- 1. New South Wales is responsible for provision of funds to Project Proponents and reporting on the implementation of the projects listed in Table 2.
- 2. The Commonwealth will contribute \$6,353,705 in total for the costs of both projects listed in Table 2 (subject to a maximum contribution for each project noted in Table 2). New South Wales will contribute \$1,000,000 in total towards the cost of both projects, with the Project Proponents contributing at least 50% of the total cost for each project. New South Wales will be responsible for ensuring the Project Proponent contributions are provided for each project.

### **Payments**

3. If the maximum Commonwealth payment shown in Table 3 is not made in a given financial year the Commonwealth may move funds into later years at its discretion. The Commonwealth makes no guarantee that unspent funding (if any) will be carried into later years. A discussion between the parties at officials level will occur prior to any decision being made on unspent funding.

### Reporting

- 4. New South Wales will provide project data updates, as requested by the Commonwealth (but no more frequently than on a quarterly basis), including any updates to data from the initial data capture or previous quarter and progress against milestones in the funding agreements between New South Wales and the Project Proponents.
- 5. New South Wales is responsible for providing advice as soon as it becomes aware a project is unlikely to progress, or if there are issues likely to impact its on-time completion.
- 6. Once a project is complete, New South Wales will provide the following data on that project to the Commonwealth as soon as practicable:
  - i) the volume and type of additional plastic waste the project will process each year
  - ii) the volume and type of additional plastic waste being processed following the project commissioning
  - iii) the feedstock for the project inputs
  - iv) the end-markets for the project offtake
  - v) the number of ongoing FTE jobs created by the project
  - vi) the environmental, social and economic benefits of the project

#### Traceability

 New South Wales will ask that Project Proponents register to use the National Framework for Recycled Content Traceability with the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water.
