# National Hydrogen Technology Skills Training Centre in Victoria

### FEDERATION FUNDING AGREEMENT - ENVIRONMENT

Parties	Commonwealth Victoria	
Duration	This Schedule is expected to expire on 30 June 2028	
Purpose	This Schedule will support the establishment of the Renewable Hydrogen Worker Training Centre (the Centre). The Commonwealth will contribute up to \$10 million in addition to the Victorian government's existing commitment of \$10 million towards the Centre. Of this \$10 million, Victoria has allocated \$2 million to resourcing and administration to lead the design and procurement of the Centre.	
	The commitments by the Parties reflects a project scale that is needed to promote hydrogen workforce development that will be needed to support the skilled workforce needs of the growing renewable hydrogen industry.	
	The Centre will provide a focal point for renewable hydrogen workforce development, benefiting both those seeking to learn new competencies and those seeking to teach the new techniques required for the renewable hydrogen sector. Though based in Victoria, training modules will meet specific industry requirements and the workers who graduate from the Centre will be able to readily apply their skills in all jurisdictions facilitating the establishment of a Australia-wide renewable hydrogen workforce.	
	Establishing this Centre will help address national clean energy workforce needs and bring forward the development of a skilled workforce to deliver Commonwealth Government's Future Made in Australia agenda and Renewable Energy Superpower ambitions. As set out the Victorian Government's <i>Cheaper, Cleaner, Renewable: Ou</i> <i>Plan for Victoria's Electricity Future</i> , the Centre will support Victoria's electricity transition by skilling, up-skilling and training Victoria's energy workforce.	

Estimated financial contributions	The Commonwealth will provide an estimated total financial contribution of up to \$10.0 million to Victoria, subject to a signed grant agreement between Victoria and a successful proponent (Proponent) for the development of the Centre. The Parties contributions to the grant amount to the Proponent will be as follows.

For a project valued at more than \$18 million, the balance of the Project cost above \$18 million will be funded by the Proponent or from other sources. terms	Commonwealth funding will be used for the establishment of the Centre through an open and competitive grant process conducted by Victoria for the selection of the Proponent and will not be used for any program administration related expenditure incurred by Victoria. Victoria will provide up to \$8 million for the grant funding and additional funding up to \$2 million to support Project delivery.			
	2. Grant administration			
	Victoria will consult with and seek agreement from the Commonwealth when establishing eligibility and assessment criteria for the grant program to ensure alignment and not duplicate the efforts of existing Commonwealth's initiatives. The criteria will include a requirement for the Centre to be located in Victoria. The requirements will specify that the Centre will support renewable hydrogen, and that other forms of hydrogen or energy technologies will be out of scope and ineligible for grant support.			
	The criteria will allow non- traditional delivery models, including cooperative models across business and workers.			
	The eligibility and assessment criteria will include commitment for the selected Proponent to work with Victoria and the Commonwealth for early and regular engagement with other states/TAFE Centres of Excellence on its activities for the purposes of:

	<ul> <li>sharing learnings on best practice and supporting knowledge translation</li> </ul>

	The eligibility and assessment criteria will include commitment to engage and collaborate with relevant Jobs and Skills Councils, industry, unions, employers, national and state accreditation authorities to ensure delivery of appropriate training in partnership with key stakeholders and the accredited training meets specific industry requirements and has the potential to be recognised nationally.			
	The eligibility and assessment criteria may include an option for the Commonwealth to evaluate the grant Project to measure how well the outcomes and objectives have been achieved at the conclusion of the Project. Victoria and the Proponent will be permitted to participate in the evaluation process.			
	Upon receiving payment from the Commonwealth, Victoria will manage and deliver payments to the Proponent in accordance with the agreement between Victoria and the Proponent under Victoria's Grant Management Framework.			

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### 3. <u>Reporting arrangements</u>

Victoria will provide performance reports in accordance with Table 2. Victoria will provide project data and share relevant information with the Commonwealth, as reasonably requested by the Commonwealth for assurance, general promotional purposes, to respond to specific enquiries, and support policy development.

#### 4. Payments

The Commonwealth will make payments in accordance with achievement of milestones in Table 2.

If the maximum Commonwealth payments are not made in a given financial year (e.g. due to delays in Project delivery), the Commonwealth will endeavor to move funds into a later year at its discretion. The Commonwealth makes no guarantee that unspent funding (if any) will be carried into later years.
