NATIONAL PARTNERSHIP ON RECYCLING INFRASTRUCTURE

PART 1: PRELIMINARIES

- A1 This Schedule has been developed in accordance with clause 15 of the National Partnership Agreement on Recycling Infrastructure and should be read in conjunction with that Agreement.
- A2 This Schedule will commence as soon as it is signed by the Commonwealth and Victoria, and will expire on 30 June 2024 or on completion of final performance reporting and processing of final payments against milestones, whichever is later.

PART 2: DELIVERY OF PROJECTS IN VICTORIA

- A3 Under this Schedule, Victoria agrees to facilitate achievement of the outcomes of the Agreement:
- a) through a competitive grants program open to private sector, non-government organisations and local government applicants for projects that enhance recycling and re-use capacity and capability in Victoria;
 - b) if agreed by the Commonwealth, through a non-competitive grants program or by identifying individual projects that enhance recycling and re-use capacity and capability in Victoria; and
 - c) through delivery of new drum pulper technology at Visy Industries Australia's Coolaroo Paper Mill by 30 June 2024, to boost Victoria's capacity to reprocess and remanufacture paper and cardboard by 95 kilo tonnes per annum.
- A4 Projects delivered by Victoria under A3 of this Schedule will require at least a matching contribution of funding from proponents consistent with clause 19 of the Agreement.
- a) For the purposes of subclause 19(a) of the Agreement, the Commonwealth agrees to recognise funding announced in February 2020 as part of the Recycling Victoria Infrastructure Fund, but not yet spent, to meet any co-funding contribution under this agreement.

PART 2A: DELIVERY OF GRANTS PROGRAMS

- A5 Victoria agrees officials from the Victorian and Commonwealth Governments will jointly agree grant assessment criteria in accordance with the eligibility criteria in the Appendix to this Agreement. Victoria agrees that all pending decisions on successful grants will be provided to the Commonwealth before a final decision is announced, and that prior agreement is reached on the nature and content of any events, announcements, promotional material or publicity relating to projects awarded by states under this Agreement, and that the roles of both Parties will be acknowledged and recognised appropriately.

PART 2B: DELIVERY OF DRUM PULPER TECHNOLOGY

- A6 Victoria will deliver the drum pulper technology by 30 June 2024 in accordance with the proposal submitted to the Commonwealth, at a total project cost of \$37,200,000.
- A7 Victoria agrees to provide its final business case to the Commonwealth for information before any payments can be made under this agreement.

PART 3: FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

- A8 The Commonwealth will provide a maximum estimated financial contribution of \$35,937,688 to Victoria. All payments are GST exclusive.
- a) Up to \$23,937,688 will be provided for the grants program outlined in Part 2A of this Schedule; and
 - b) Up to \$12,000,000 for the installation of drum pulper technology at Visy Industries Australia's Coolaroo Paper Mill as outlined in Part 2B of this Schedule.
- A9 The estimated financial contribution to be provided by the Commonwealth is outlined in Table 1.

Note: Balance of non-Commonwealth contributions includes contributions from Victoria to at least match the Commonwealth's contribution but does not include contributions from third parties such as local governments and other non-government organisations.

PART 4: PROJECT MILESTONES, REPORTING AND PAYMENTS

- A10 Table 2 summarises the project milestones, their relationship to the outputs, expected completion dates, relevant reporting dates and expected payments to be made. The Commonwealth will make payments subject to Victoria demonstrating that the relevant milestone has been met.
- A11 If the maximum Commonwealth payments are not made in a given financial year (e.g. due to lack of acceptable project proposals) the Commonwealth may move funds into a later year at its discretion. The Commonwealth makes no guarantee that unspent funding (if any) will be carried into later years.


