Additional terms

Financial Contributions

- Queensland is responsible for provision of funds to industry partners and reporting on the implementation of the projects listed in Table 3.
- The Commonwealth will contribute up to one third of the cost of each project listed in Table 3 and Queensland will at least match the Commonwealth's contribution for each project. Queensland will ensure each Industry Partner provides the remaining funding for each project.

Payments

- 3 The Commonwealth will make payments subject to Queensland demonstrating that relevant milestones have been met.
- If the maximum Commonwealth payment shown in Table 2 is not made in a given financial year the Commonwealth may move funds into a later year at its discretion. The Commonwealth makes no guarantee that unspent funding (if any) will be carried into later years.

Reporting

- Queensland will report annually to demonstrate performance against indicators a – d below and that Commonwealth funding has been matched. These reports will include:
 - (a) a statement of funds paid to Industry Partners
 - (b) a statement of cash and in-kind contributions from Industry Partners
 - (c) details of projects:
 - progress made in delivering the project including:
 - progress made to finalise funding arrangements between Queensland and its Industry Partners
 - ii) progress made to obtain appropriate regulatory approvals to conduct the project
 - iii) construction/installation progress
 - 2 the number of full-time equivalent (FTE) jobs created during the construction phase of the project

(d) for completed projects:

- the volume of additional organic waste each facility is able to process each year (total additional capacity)
- 2 the volume of additional organic waste actually being processed following project commissioning (actual used capacity)
- 3 the markets that have been/are being developed for recycled organic products produced by each facility
- 4 the number of ongoing FTE jobs created as a result of the project
- 5 project benefits realised including how the quality, safety and consistency of recycled organic products has been improved.

- 6 Queensland will provide project data to the Commonwealth on a quarterly basis.
- Queensland is responsible for providing early advice to the Commonwealth on projects that are unlikely to progress or if issues arise that will impact project completion.
