Duration	This Schedule is expected to expire on 31 December 2027 or on completion of the initiatives, including final performance reporting and processing of final payments against milestones.
Purpose	 The Schedule supports Action 12 of the National Teacher Workforce Action Plan: To pilot new approaches to reduce teacher workload through a Workload Reduction Fund to maximise the value of a teacher's time. This Schedule supports the delivery of the Small School Shared Position Model pilot, the End-to-End Teacher Recruitment Model pilot, and the Shared Services Model – Top End Region pilot. Any further projects are to be determined by mutual agreement between parties and specified through amendments to this Schedule and accompanied by additional implementation plans. Small School Shared Position Model pilot The Small School Shared Position Model pilot supports workload reduction for teachers and school leaders in small remote and very remote schools in the Top End region through a shared service model. The pilot includes four shared positions, each tasked with responsibilities that reduce workloads by assisting teachers and school leaders with a range of administrative tasks, as well as providing professional support for participating schools, such as coaching and mentoring. End-to-End Teacher Recruitment Model pilot The End-to-End Teacher Recruitment Model pilot provides centralised staff recruitment support to reduce the workload and administrative burden associated with recruitment. A dedicated 'Talent Acquisition' team will provide direct support to schools, with each region allocated contact to ensure service continuity.

	Under the pilot, a total of 10 FTE will support recruitment administration practices and applicant screening; facilitate central teacher recruitment campaigns; provide access to a hotline for bus school leadership teams; coordinate teacher transfers and placement unattached officers in support of increased teacher permanency an mobility for retention; and provide workforce planning advice. Shared Services Model – Top End Region pilot Building on the Small School Shared Position Model pilot, which w implemented by the Northern Territory during 2023 and 2024, the Shared Services Model – Top End Region pilot will provide regional centralised shared service support for remote and very remote sch in the Top End Region. Four shared positions, including a Curriculu Coach (Literacy), Secondary Provision specialist, Special Education Teacher (Wellbeing and Inclusion), and an Executive Support Offic will reduce workloads and administration burden by supporting teachers and teaching principals. Participating schools are invested the shared services model by way of financial contribution. Supports offered to schools participating in the pilot include coach and mentoring; professional learning; modelling best practice; professional co-design; facilitating networking to build relationshi share successes and ideas across schools; and providing wellbeing support.					and as Ily ools m er,
