Purpose	This Schedule will support the delivery of the four (4) accessible amenities listed at Attachment A , with a total of \$596,074.80 (GST exclusive) being provided to South Australia in 2025-26. The agreed accessible amenities are comprised of:			
	The following accessible infrastructure, eligible for up to 50% build cost contribution:			
	 Fixed-place Changing Places in four (4) LGAs at \$1,007,195.95. 			
	Accessible infrastructure is an essential service that enables people with high support needs to actively participate in their community and will enhance community accessibility.			
	The South Australian Government has committed to a cumulative 5 accessible amenities from financial years 2022-2023 through 2025-2026. This commitment meets the minimum threshold required to qualify for the Commonwealth's Project Coordination Fund. As such, the Commonwealth agrees to provide the Government of South Australia a one-off payment to support resourcing as part of the Project Coordination Fund. This will be offered as part of this Federation Funding Agreement and aligns with the first eligible financial year in which the minimum facility requirement was met.			
	This supplement will support the South Australian Government resourcing to manage the construction of funded accessible amenities and support the delivery of the Commonwealth's Accessible Australia initiative.			
	The first 5 eligible projects that enable the South Australian Government to satisfy the Project Coordination Fund threshold are as follows:			
	Location 1: FY2022-23, Fabrik Arts and Heritage, Adelaide Hills Council, Changing Places facility, commenced August 2024, completed December 2024.			
	 Location 2: FY2022-23, George Bolton Swimming Centre, City of Burnside, Changing Places facility, commenced July 2023, completed February 2024. 			

- Location 3: FY2023-24 Glenthorne National Park, City of Marion, Changing Places facility, commenced June 2024, completed November 2024.
- Location 4: FY2023-24, Pasadena Community Centre, City of Mitcham Council, Changing Places facility, commenced September 2024, due for completion July 2025.
- Location 5: FY2024-25, Dukes Highway at Coonalpyn, Coorong District Council, Changing Places facility, building due to commence July 2025, due for completion December 2025.

Estimated financial contributions

The Commonwealth will provide an estimated total financial contribution to South Australia of \$596,074.80 (GST exclusive) in respect of this Schedule as follows:

Additional terms

- 1. To support an increase in jurisdictions' uptake of the Accessible Australia initiative, South Australia is eligible for the amount in Table 1 once the Commonwealth and South Australia have signed this schedule and the Commonwealth has accepted the completed milestones for payment as detailed in Table 2.
- 2. The build commencement of each proposed amenity must occur within 12 months of receiving Commonwealth funding for that amenity. The final date for commencement of construction may be no later than 12 months from the initial Commonwealth payment. Final dates for commencement of construction are as follows:
 - Locations 1 to 4: 8 September 2026
- 3. Projects must be complete within 18 months of build commencement. Any anticipated delays or slippages to build completion must be reported to the Commonwealth.
- 4. Should one or all project/s funded in this agreement be unable to achieve the deliverables and/or requirements of this agreement within the agreed timeframe, South Australia agrees to work with the Department of Health, Disability and Ageing to find an alternative project within South Australia to

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- reallocate received Commonwealth funding for alternative accessible infrastructure. Should this be unachievable South Australia will be asked to return Commonwealth funds for the affected amenity to the Commonwealth, on request from the Commonwealth.
- 5. The Commonwealth Government is providing up to 100% of the funding required to build and/or purchase each agreed accessible infrastructure amenity as per the funding commitment (Commonwealth contribution amounts stated at Attachment A).
- 6. South Australia will be responsible for coordinating all remaining funding, including:
 - Any subsequent increase in costs associated with builds;
 - Supporting infrastructure outside of build specifications;
 - Ongoing and maintenance costs of each accessible amenity build under this agreement;
 - Installation of security for each accessible amenity built under this agreement (where deemed necessary by the relevant jurisdiction).
- 7. South Australia will also be responsible for:
 - Ensuring build has commenced within 12 months of receiving the first instalment of Commonwealth funding;
 - Project/s are completed within 18 months of build commencement.
 - Ensuring all accessible amenities are listed on the National Public Toilet Map within 60 days of build completion.
- 8. For Changing Places facilities, both fixed-place and portable, South Australia will also be responsible for:
 - The cost of accreditation by a Changing Places assessor;
 - The cost of training of Changing Places assessors (if needed);
 - Ensuring Changing Places assessors are engaged prior to the construction of a Changing Places facility to assess project documentation and ensure correct design specifications are in place including:
 - o Schematic design review
 - o Construction documentation review
 - o As-built final review.
 - Ensuring each facility is accredited by a Changing Places assessor to ensure builds meet the performance requirements detailed in the *Changing Places Design Specifications 2020* and comply with the National Construction Code requirements for Accessible Adult Change Facilities; and
 - Ensuring all Changing Places facilities are registered on the National Public Toilet Map within 60 days of build completion.
