Purpose	This Schedule will support the delivery of elements of the Reconnecting River Country Program (the Program) to be operable by 31 December 2026.
	This amendment to the Schedule follows completion of the Checkpoint Review milestone (Table 3) in February 2025 and adds milestones and terms for the Murrumbidgee River Constraints Measure – Securing a flow corridor in the Murrumbidgee. The milestones aim to enable the delivery of environmental flows up to the maximum flow rate allowable (32,000 ML/day) under the current Murrumbidgee Water Sharing Plan.
	The Program comprises river constraints alleviation measures for the Murray-Darling Basin Plan which form part of the Sustainable Diversion Limits Adjustment Mechanism: — NSW Murray River (Hume to Yarrawonga and Yarrawonga to Wakool reaches) and — the Murrumbidgee River.
	The Program aims to increase the frequency and extent that rivers connect to wetlands and floodplains in the Murrumbidgee and Murray River systems.
	The Program will achieve this through relaxing physical, operational, legal and policy barriers that prevent the flexible use of water for the environment. The Program is being delivered to achieve the greatest possible environmental outcomes by 31 December 2026.
	 This Schedule funds New South Wales to: progress actions to provide river operators with the authorising environment to deliver higher environmental flows undertake further technical studies to inform a final business case for constraints alleviation in the Murray River secure up to 40% of the inundation area in the flow corridor in the Murrumbidgee, to enable by December 2026 flows up to the

 - Quarterly project updates including financial expenditure summary
 - Project closure reports when applicable, or equivalent documents.

Asset ownership and recurrent costs

- 7. Any assets being constructed or modified by NSW as part of this Schedule have clear asset ownership pathways (i.e. private landholders, River Murray Joint Venture, WaterNSW, NSW Parks and Wildlife Service).
- 8. The Commonwealth will not acquire any assets nor any liability for any operations, maintenance or recurrent costs from works undertaken or associated with this Schedule.

Procurement for infrastructure projects (Mundarlo Bridge, Mundowy Lane, Werai Forest regulators) (tables 5 to 7)

- 9. To improve the Commonwealth's visibility of the cost and time required to deliver the infrastructure projects by 31 December 2026, NSW agrees to provide the Commonwealth written advice on the cost and time outcomes of Design and Construction procurements for the projects 20 business days before recommending preferred tenderers to the NSW delegate.
- 10. The advice should include the pre-tender estimate of cost and practical completion date for the package, and the preferred tenderer's proposed cost and practical completion date for the package.
- 11. The Commonwealth will respond to NSW in writing within 10 business days of receipt of NSW's advice to confirm it has no concerns with NSW proceeding to award contracts for the packages.

Governance

- 12. Through NSW's existing project governance arrangements, NSW will notify the Commonwealth should any matters arise, that would inhibit complete and timely delivery of the Project.
- 13. NSW and the Commonwealth senior executives will hold quarterly meetings to discuss the projects in this schedule and any risks to the implementation of those projects. NSW will provide written progress reports to support these meetings.

Project Execution Plan

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Table 3, Milestone 2 (Implementation Planning) requires NSW to provide a Project Execution Plan for the Securing a flow corridor in the Murrumbidgee project.

The Plan is to describe the arrangements and outputs for delivering the Murrumbidgee flow corridor, the scoping and design of public works and First Nations enabling measures, including (where appropriate):

- Scope in accordance with the final business case, the flow corridor delivery plan and the legislative framework
- Outputs to be delivered overall and for each milestone
- How outputs are to be delivered for the flow corridor negotiations (including numbers of eligible landholders and properties)
- Updates to the delivery strategy previously outlined in the Milestone 1 flow corridor delivery plan
- Project delivery schedule, and budget
- Procurement strategy
- Risks and mitigation strategies
- Stakeholder engagement strategies and management
- Governance arrangements

Milestone Reporting

Milestone progress reports and supporting evidence are to show:

- Progress against the Project Execution Plan including advised changes, achievement of outputs specified for that milestone.
- Summary of negotiation status including number of flow corridor negotiations commenced, negotiation status, and number of agreements reached.
- Issues and risks that have become evident and mitigation measures.

Completion Report for Murrumbidgee flow corridor negotiations

The Completion Report for Murrumbidgee flow corridor negotiations is an evaluation describing:

- Operational handover and summary of stakeholder engagement activities.
- Reporting on the landholder negotiations, including number and percentage of landholder agreements finalised.
- Lessons learned and recommendations for delivery of the remainder of the flow corridor in the Murrumbidgee.
- Financial expenditure summary for the entire project.
