Purpose	This Schedule will support the establishment of a Women's and Family Maternity Care Centre at Yass and the enhancement of midwifery-led maternity support services in the Yass Valley.				
	The Women's and Family Maternity Care Centre will be delivered through upgrades to the Eric Bell Centre in Yass to include clinical rooms, space for group classes, mother's groups and community meetings, and a kitchenette for use by women and their families. The Centre will integrate outreach antenatal and postnatal services with other maternity services including:				
	<ul> <li>culturally safe antenatal and postnatal care for Aboriginal families,</li> <li>via establishment of an Aboriginal Maternal and Infant Health</li> <li>Service and Building Strong Foundations service.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>onsite face to face and virtual childbirth and parenting education including perinatal education resources to support classes.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>a lactation consultant service, breastfeeding and infant feeding with virtual care capability to support rural women across the District.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>a trauma informed postnatal debrief service, for women who have questions or concerns following their birth (or postnatal period), or who may have experienced physical and/or psychological birth trauma.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>Women's and babies' physiotherapy services.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>a virtual care hub, with midwifery support, 7 days a week.</li> </ul>				
	The enhancement of midwifery-led maternity support services under this Schedule will include establishment of a Midwifery Group Practice model at Goulburn and Queanbeyan hospitals that will prioritise pregnant women in the Yass community and provide a choice of birthing at either hospital with a known midwife to improve health and wellbeing outcomes for women, their partners and families.				

## Estimated financial contributions

The Commonwealth will provide an estimated total financial contribution to New South Wales of \$4.7m in respect of this Schedule.

## Additional terms

New South Wales will provide a project status update on 31 January of each year from January 2026 until all performance milestones (see Table 2) are complete. Project status updates will provide a summary overview of activities undertaken since the prior performance milestone and identify any risks (and mitigations) as relevant to the next performance milestone (see Table 2). Project status updates will be provided in writing and are not intended to replicate performance milestone reports (which require the provision of quantifying data).

The Parties acknowledge that the National Health Reform Agreement recognises New South Wales as the system manager of the public hospital system in the state; and that New South Wales will determine the ongoing suitability of the services established under this Schedule beyond the term of the Schedule, following review of their impact and sustainability.

The National Health Reform Agreement provides that the Commonwealth will not fund a service where the same service, or any part of the same service, is otherwise funded by the Commonwealth. New South Wales will ensure that any claim for funding under the National Health Reform Agreement is not funding services, or any part of a service, provided for under this agreement and will maintain appropriate records.
