- d) The Commonwealth will initiate and fund the evaluation of the Program. Commonwealth funding for the evaluation is separate from funding for the Program provided by this Schedule.
- e) The Commonwealth will share the outcomes of the evaluation with all jurisdictions for transparency and to support national awareness.
- f) Evaluation will inform decision-making about future arrangements including Commonwealth funding decisions.
- g) The Commonwealth will fund national promotion and communication activities to promote the Program. These activities will be delivered by peak organisations to support new applicants to the Program, in addition to information and resources for clinicians. Peak organisations will consult with states and territories to ensure consistent messaging with any state and territory communications. Commonwealth funding for the communication activities is separate from funding for the Program provided by this Schedule.

## States and Territories agree:

- h) To provide or facilitate access to oral PrEP to people eligible to access the Program.
- i) To enable access to oral PrEP medication through jurisdictional supply or other arrangements as determined by the jurisdictions.
- j) That program delivery and patient management will be determined by each jurisdiction in alignment with the 2021 ASHM Australian PrEP Guidelines (the PrEP Guidelines).
- k) That where the Commonwealth funding under this Schedule is less than the total cost of delivering the Program, States and Territories are expected to fund the difference.
- To ensure patients are advised that access to the Program is to be used only for the purpose of HIV prevention of the specific individual, for the duration of their stay in Australia during which they are ineligible for Medicare.
- m) To ensure patients are advised of the risks associated with PrEP use and to adhere to the current PrEP Guidelines; and that any costs incurred from side effects of PrEP medication will not be

- subsidised under this Program and are to be funded through private arrangements such as private health insurance.
- n) To support communication activities funded by the Commonwealth and make best efforts to promote the Program to people at risk of HIV transmission and who are not eligible for Medicare.
- To provide annual reports as detailed in Table 2. Annual reports provided by jurisdictions can include feedback on issues associated with financial and operational aspects.
- p) To participate in and support the evaluation of the Program through the submission of annual reporting based upon Attachment B.

## Access PrEP medication for the target population

• Funding under the Program can be used for the purchase of any oral PrEP medications available on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme. States and Territories must ensure prescription and patient management adheres to the 2012 ASHM Australian PrEP Guidelines.

## Medium and long-term outcomes

• The intent of these outcomes is to gather information from the implementation of the Program that can be compared to other HIV surveillance and reporting datasets for the purpose of determining whether the Program is contributing to Australia's strategic policy objective of virtual elimination.

# Access to Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) for people who are not eligible for Medicare

The Access to PrEP for people who are not eligible for Medicare Program (the Program) is a joint Commonwealth and State and Territory initiative to provide access to PrEP to people at risk of HIV transmission living with HIV in Australia<sup>1</sup> who are not eligible for Medicare.
