Additional terms

Administration costs

1) Up to \$59,010.25 (GST exclusive) may be used by the State of New South Wales for program administration processes. This arrangement and the basis for these costs are specific to the BCRRP.

Allocation of funds

2) The Parties understand that this Schedule is made in good faith and that there is an expectation that funding will be apportioned to project as detailed at <u>Attachment A</u>.

Implementation Plan

- 3) An Implementation Plan for the project will be submitted to NEMA prior to commencement of this Schedule, for decision on whether funding will be granted.
 - a. The requirements of the Implementation Plan are set out in the Audit and Reporting Framework for the Program, as issued by the Commonwealth and amended from time to time and to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the terms of this Schedule.
- 4) The project's Implementation Plan will be submitted by the State of New South Wales to the Commonwealth. The State of New South Wales will work with the Project Lead to develop the Implementation Plan.
- 5) A project cannot formally commence under the BCRRP until this Schedule has been co-signed and a funding agreement has been entered into between the State of New South Wales and the Project Lead.
- 6) During project delivery the State of New South Wales has the authority to amend the Implementation Plan's project scope and project timeframes where the matter/s have no financial impacts and project activities remain within the program end date. Otherwise, the NEMA Program Delegate must approve the change. There will be no increase to the Commonwealth's financial contribution to the project or administration costs to the State of New South Wales.

Performance monitoring and reporting

7) The Project Lead will undertake the project activity as agreed with the State of New South Wales. The State of New South Wales will monitor progress and make payments when project requirements are met.

- 8) The frequency and timing of reporting under this Schedule is set out at <u>Table 2</u>: <u>Performance requirements, reporting and payment summary</u>.
- 9) The content requirements of reports under this Schedule are set out in the Audit and Reporting Framework for the Program, as issued by the Commonwealth and amended from time to time and to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the terms of this Schedule.
- 10) Throughout the project period, the Commonwealth may ask the State of New South Wales for ad-hoc reports, including but not limited to interim reports, details of media events, information requests from the Commonwealth Minister and meetings to discuss project implementation.

Third Party

- 11) The State of New South Wales may engage third parties to support the delivery of the project under this Schedule.
- of New South Wales is responsible for ensuring third party compliance with the terms and conditions of this Schedule.

Repayments of amounts to the Commonwealth

13) In the event that efficiencies or underspends are identified in a project, or, the State of New South Wales does not meet a condition of the Schedule, the Commonwealth may seek to recover the funds as determined by the circumstances of each individual matter.
