Purpose	This Schedule will support the delivery of eight initiatives: • Expansion of the Peel Hospital Campus and associated services including: ○ Construction of an expanded Peel Health Campus Emergency Department; ○ Establishment of a new Community Mental Health Facility and specialised Community Eating Disorders Service in the Peel Community ○ Completion of forward works for the Peel Hospital Campus Development • Construction of a new hospital at Laverton to provide emergency, population health and ambulatory care services. • Construction of a new Radiation Oncology facility for the Midwest region at the Geraldton Health Campus • Implementation of the Western Australian Country Health Service (WACHS) Cancer Strategy 2017-22 • Upgrade of critical infrastructure at the King Edward Memorial Hospital • Youth Forensic Inpatient Service – establishment of a 10 bed youth forensic mental health ward at Graylands Hospital • Construction of a Mental Health Emergency Centre at the St John of God Midland Hospital • Comprehensive genomic testing to expedite excellence in treatment of Western Australian cancer patients.

Additional terms	Western Australia will ensure the Commonwealth is provided with contemporary information about the expected delivery schedule for each project (expected major milestone delivery dates including completion) and advise the Commonwealth as soon as practicable of any significant deviations from agreed project plans. Western Australia will provide bi-annual project status reports for each project in May and November each year until completion. Bi-annual status reports will address progress towards achieving the objective of each output in the context of the delivery schedule for each project, include photographic evidence of progress (capital projects only), and outline expected activities within the coming six months. Status reports may be provided in conjunction with reports addressing performance milestones (see Table 2) where their timing is aligned (within 1 month). In regard to the 'Upgrade of critical infrastructure at the King Edward Memorial Hospital' output, the parties agree that the <i>Project Agreement for the Community Health and Hospitals Program Western Australian 2018-19 Initiatives</i> is superseded by this Schedule and that all reporting for this output will occur in accordance with this Schedule. The National Health Reform Agreement (NHRA) provides that the Commonwealth will not fund a service where the same service, or any part of the same service, is otherwise funded by the Commonwealth. Western Australia will ensure that any claim for funding under the NHRA is not funding services, or any part of a service, provided for under this agreement and will maintain appropriate records.											

	The Parties agree that further variation to this Schedule will be negotiated to confirm the deliverables and expected delivery timeframes for the Youth Forensic Inpatient Service and Construction of a Mental Health Emergency Centre at the St John of God Midland Hospital outputs once Western Australia is able to confirm its delivery approach for these outputs. The Parties acknowledge that any remaining payments against these outputs are dependent on the prescription of appropriate performance milestones in Table 2.

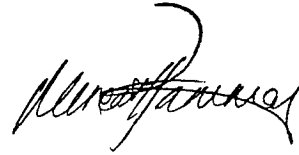
